AND NOW, this 18th day of April 2018, after consideration of Respondent's Motion to Excise, and Respondent's Motion for Admission into Judicial Diversionary Program, it is hereby ORDERED that the Motion to Excise is GRANTED; and the Motion for Admission is DENIED.

Statement of Reasons

- 1. This Court established an Interim Judicial Diversionary Program during 2016, as reflected in the Interim Policy Statement filed of record in the matter of *In re Domitrovich*, No. 1 JD 14;
- 2. The Judicial Conduct Board filed a response to Respondent's Motion for Admission on April 9, 2018, in which the Board objects to Respondent's admission into the Interim Judicial Diversionary Program.
 - 3. PA. CONST. Article V, §18(b)(5) provides that:
 - "Upon the filing of formal charges with the Court by the Board, the Court shall promptly schedule a hearing or hearings to determine whether a sanction should be imposed . . . pursuant the provisions of this section."
- 4. Article V, §18(b)(5) of the Pennsylvania Constitution requires that the Board consent to any Respondent's admission into the Interim Judicial Diversionary Program.
