**RE: Objection to Northampton County's

To Whom It May Concern,

On behalf of **D.C. 03-2-01**, kindly accept this letter brief in support of my prior objection to Northampton County's "Proposed Realignment Plan 2021-2022." I am specifically objecting to that portion of the Plan which proposes to transfer approximately **Nine Thousand (9,000)** parking cases¹ from D.C. 03-1-04 to **D.C. 03-2-01**. Attached hereto as Exhibit A is a copy of the objection which I previously submitted to Northampton County on February 16, 2022.

I. Background

Approximately 25 years ago, Northampton County transferred all of the parking cases from the south-side of Bethlehem (D.C. 03-2-10) to Hanover Township (D.C. 03-1-04) in order to even the caseload between these two district

courts. Now, in an effort “to alleviate the workload in 03-1-04,” Northampton County is proposing to transfer these cases to **D.C. 03-2-01**, which is located on the north-side of Bethlehem and currently processes approximately **Six Thousand (6,000)** parking cases per year.²

Since taking office in 2010, **D.C. 03-2-01** has consistently had either the second or third highest case filings in Northampton County. This is primarily due to the high number of parking cases filed at **D.C. 03-2-01** every year. Similarly, during this same period of time, D.C. 03-1-04 has consistently had either the highest or second highest case filings per year, again primarily due to the high number of parking cases filed in this Court every year. For your reference, I have enclosed copies of Northampton County’s Case Filing Statistics and Case Filings Per Secretary from 2014-2019, which are attached hereto as Exhibit B.

In 2021, approximately Nine Thousand (9,000) parking cases were docketed in D.C. 03-1-04 while an additional Six Thousand (6,000) parking cases were docketed in **D.C. 03-2-01**. For your reference, I have enclosed copies of the 2021 Parking Dispositions and Total Cases Docketed for both D.C. 03-1-04 and **03-2-01**, which are attached hereto as Exhibit C.

II. Life Cycle of a Parking Case

The following represents the life cycle of a typical parking case filed at D.C. 03-2-01:

1. Ticket;
2. Summons;
3. Warrant for Summons Undelivered or Failure to Respond;
4. Disposition;
5. Time-Payment;
6. Warrant for Failure to Pay;
7. Payment Determination Hearing;
8. Additional Time-Payment; and
9. Repeat Steps 6-8, if necessary.

While parking cases may not be the most serious cases handled by a district court, this unfortunately does not translate into ease of adjudication. While this may not be the proper forum to question the legitimacy of the Weighted Caseload Study, I believe that parking cases should have been assessed individually rather than lumped together as a whole with traffic cases. Initially, when considering parking cases, one has to appreciate the sheer number of case filings per year. No other type of case comes close to matching the volume of paperwork generated by parking cases. In addition, unlike most other cases, many parking cases never

leave the district court in which they were initially filed because of the endless cycle of time-payments, warrants and payment determination hearings. What all of this means is that an inordinate amount of time and resources are required to process and adjudicate parking cases. I have been a Magisterial District Judge for 12 years, and I can state with absolute certainty that parking cases are the most labor intensive cases that a district court can handle.

III. Impact on D.C. 03-2-01

Based on current statistics, in the event Northampton County's proposal is approved, it is clear that the number of parking cases filed at **D.C. 03-2-01** each year will increase from **Six Thousand (6,000)** to **Fifteen Thousand (15,000)**. This, in turn, will increase **D.C. 03-2-01's** total case filings from approximately **Eight Thousand (8,000)** to **Seventeen Thousand (17,000)** per year. This would then result in **D.C. 03-2-01** having nearly triple the number of case filings of any other district court in Northampton County. Simply put, this would create an untenable situation at **D.C. 03-2-01**.

At the current time, **D.C. 03-2-01** is struggling to keep pace with the litany of parking cases filed each day. I cannot fathom, and Northampton County's proposal is silent, as to how my Court can possibly absorb an additional Nine


Thousand (9,000) parking cases. The Court which Northampton County proposes to transfer these parking cases from has both the space and personnel to handle its existing parking caseload. Specifically, D.C. 03-1-04 has Six (6) MDJ Technicians while my Court has only Four (4). Northampton County's proposal makes no provision whatsoever for the hiring of additional personnel at my Court to handle the flood of additional parking cases. It should also be noted that the building in which my Court is located has only enough space to accommodate Four (4) MDJ Technicians. Accordingly, I believe D.C. 03-2-01 would have to be relocated to a larger space in the event Northampton County's proposal is approved. Finally, any relocation may have to be outside of the district served by D.C. 03-2-01 as I am unaware of another suitable property located within my district which could accommodate the needs of the Court.

IV. Conclusion

Upon review of the current case filing statistics, it is clear that Northampton County's proposal to transfer approximately **Nine Thousand (9,000)** additional parking cases to D.C. 03-2-01 is simply unjustified. The only thing that Northampton County's proposal will serve to accomplish is to create an even bigger problem at D.C. 03-2-01 than the one that already exists at 03-1-04. I

believe that Northampton County has failed to establish how it is fair and equitable to transfer approximately Nine Thousand (9,000) parking cases from one court to another when the court on the receiving end already processes approximately Six Thousand (6,000) parking cases per year, and consistently has one of the highest caseloads in Northampton County every year. I truly believe that **D.C. 03-2-01** will suffer irreparable harm in the event Northampton County's proposal is approved. It is for this reason that I respectfully request that the Supreme Court deny Northampton County's "Proposed Realignment Plan 2021-2022" as it relates to **D.C. 03-2-01**.
