Pennsylvania Supreme Court Appoints Ross to Civil Procedural Rules Committee

HARRISBURG, January 5, 2001 — The Supreme Court of Pennsylvania today announced the appointment of Robert Ross, Esq., of Philadelphia, to the Civil Procedural Rules Committee.

The Civil Procedural Rules Committee was created in 1937 by the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania to assist in the preparation, revision, promulgation, publication and administration of civil actions at law and in equity for the Courts of Common Pleas.

The committee, which is the oldest of the Supreme Court's committees, covers all aspects of civil practice before the Courts of Common Pleas except those relating to the Orphans' Court and Family Court divisions.

The Supreme Court appoints committee members to three-year terms. Each member may serve a maximum of two full terms. The committee membership consists of 15 lawyers and judges plus one *ex officio* member.

Ross will complete the unexpired term of the Honorable D. Donald Jamieson that ends June 30, 2002.
