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MDJS BAIL PROCESSING

A number of Help Desk calls relating to MDJS bail processing program fixes were reviewed and corrected in the system. When processing bail, you should not see any changes to the way you currently process bail. However, you will notice that some issues have been corrected such as:

- ? The surety name on the Surety Information page prints on the correct line on the form.
- ? The Next Court Information block for the Bail Bond and Surety Information page shows the date/time/location of future court actions.
- ? The Date of Charges(s) prints on the Bail Bond and Surety Information page.
- ? If monetary bail has been posted and the amount of the bail is later decreased, then the bail paperwork prints correctly when the BMOD action is completed.

NCIC OFFENSE CODE (POLICE CRIMINAL COMPLAINT FORM)

The AOPC has received many calls regarding the NCIC Offense Code on the new police criminal complaint form. There is a field for this code to the right of offense on the charge page of the complaint. This code is mandatory for the criminal court case warrant to be accepted into NCIC, however many court staff do not receive this code on the complaint and are concerned that the warrants are rejected. Furthermore, we had some reports where officers told court staff that the codes are mapped in the MDJS and the court needs to determine the correct code using the MDJS.

Here's how it works. If the officer records the NCIC Offense Code for the offense(s) on the complaint, you must enter the code(s) in the MDJS using F7 (NCIC Information) on the charge entry screen. If the officer doesn't record the NCIC Offense Code(s) on the complaint, you do not need to be concerned with trying to make a determination of the code or you should not deny the filing of the complaint based on the absence of the code. Some charges have a NCIC Offense Code mapping assigned, and therefore the NCIC Offense Code(s) will be supplied when the warrant passes through the JNET systems before it is sent to NCIC/CLEAN. Again, you only need to record what is presented to you on the complaint.
