

Rule 1023.1. Scope. Signing of Documents. Representations to the Court. Violation

(e) Section 8355 of the Judicial Code, 42 Pa.C.S. § 8355, is suspended absolutely, in accordance with the provision of the Constitution of 1968, Article V, Section 10(c).

NOTE: Section 8355 of the Judicial Code provides for the certification of pleadings, motions and other papers.

Rule 1036. Dismissal Upon Affidavit of Noninvolvement

(a) As used in this rule, "action" means an action subject to an Act of Assembly which provides for dismissal of the action as to a party based upon an affidavit of noninvolvement.

NOTE: Actions pursuant to the following Acts of Assembly are within the scope of this rule: Section 7502 of the Judicial Code, 42 Pa.C.S. 7502, an action for negligence against a construction design professional and [Section 827-A of the Health Care Services Malpractice Act, 40 P.S. 1301.827-A,] Section 506 of the Medical Care Availability and Reduction of Error (Mcare) Act, 40 P.S. § 1303.506, a medical [malpractice] professional liability action naming a health care provider as a defendant.
