	2. The average workloads of three (3) of Armstrong County's Magisterial Districts (33-		
	3-01, 02, and 03) are higher than that of 6 th Class Counties as a whole.		
	3. The single Magisterial District in Armstrong County whose workload is lower than that of 6 th Class Counties as a whole, is 33-3-04. Yet 33-3-04 is by far the largest District in terms of territory. A glance at the enclosed map shows that 33-3-04		

- 3. The single Magisterial District in Armstrong County whose workload is lower than that of 6th Class Counties as a whole, is 33-3-04. Yet 33-3-04 is by far the largest District in terms of territory. A glance at the enclosed map shows that 33-3-04 encompasses about one-half of the entire county. Currently, the Magisterial District Judge office for 33-3-04 is in Rural Valley Borough, centrally located in the District, and providing a moderately convenient location for the District's far-flung residents. To eliminate this District and to divide it among two or more of the other three Districts is wholly impractical for the reasons set forth in #4, #5, #6, #7, and #8, below.
- 4. If Armtrong County were to lose a Magisterial District, its three (3) remaining districts would average 220 square miles each.
- 5. Concomitant to No. 4, above, the current vehicular travel times from the most distant point of each Magisterial District to the current Magisterial District Judge office are as follows:

33-3-01

Freeport to Ford City

25 minutes

33-3-02

Parker to Kittanning

45 minutes

33-3-03

Shady Plain to Leechburg

30 minutes

33-3-04

Mateer To Rural Valley

40 minutes

If Armstrong County loses one of its four Magisterial Districts, driving times will balloon and result in great public and private inconvenience, and increased costs to our residents and municipalities.

- 6. A noteworthy geographic feature of Armstrong County is that the County is cut in half by the Allegheny River. There are only three (3) bridges which directly connect the eastern half and the western half of the County. All three of these bridges are in the Kittanning-Ford City area in the central part of the County, and the northernmost and southernmost of them are only five (5) miles apart. Accordingly, a person cannot drive from one side of the Allegheny River to the other anywhere north of Kittanning. Also a person cannot drive from one side to the other south of Ford City.
- 7. Further, if District 33-3-04 were eliminated in the future when Magisterial District Judge Samuel R. Goldstrohm (33-3-04), currently age 62, retires, his sprawling district would have to be divided so that ManorvilleBorough, where Magisterial District Judge DeComo (33-3-01) lives, and Kittanning Borough, where Magisterial District Judge Owen (33-3-02) lives, remain in separate districts. Manorville and Kittanning are within sight of each other! This constraint seriously aggravates the redistricting problem.
- 8. If District 33-3-04 were eliminated, its judicial office would likely be moved from its current location in Rural Valley Borough to a new one closer to population centers in the southern part of the county. The lease for the current site, however, does not expire until 2018. Also, if District 33-3-04 were eliminated, the judicial office of District 33-3-01 would have to be moved in a similar direction; yet, the lease for the building does not expire until the end of 2019.
- 9. Marcellus shale gas drilling activities have begun and will undoubtedly substantially increase within the next decade. The customary attendant problems will increase as well.


