Dear Mr. Mittleman:

Please find the enclosed reestablishment plan for the Twenty-Fourth (24th) Judicial District of Pennsylvania. Included are a Judicial District Summary Worksheet, Six (6) Magisterial District Worksheets and a map showing the breakdown of the Magisterial Districts and major roadways.

At this time, Blair County does not propose the elimination of a Magisterial District. Our plan includes the reestablishment of three (3) Magisterial Districts, the realignment of three (3) Magisterial Districts, and an Administrative Order to more evenly distribute the caseload. We have verified that the office and residence of the Magisterial District Judges are within their respective district boundaries.

For historical purposes, upon the untimely passing of Magisterial District Judge Joseph Moran, Blair County President Judge Jolene Grubb Kopriva voluntarily submitted a recommendation in October 2010 to close Magisterial District Court 24-1-01, located in the city of Altoona. The Supreme Court of Pennsylvania, in an order dated October 15, 2010, eliminated Magisterial District Court 24-1-01 and the office was closed by AOPC on November 30, 2010. As part of the elimination of this district, the City of Altoona was reconfigured between the two (2) remaining Magisterial Districts.

Blair County, like several other counties throughout the Commonwealth, possesses a unique geographic layout comprised of varying socioeconomic factors. Blair County is typically broken down into three distinct areas: the City of Altoona, the shopping district – primarily Logan Township and the remaining areas of Blair County. As evidenced by the attached map, the shopping district of Logan Township is actually divided by and surrounds the City of Altoona. The City of Altoona is associated with a high population density and higher crime

rates. The shopping district of Blair County has a high number of civil disputes, crime and traffic cases. The remaining areas of Blair County contain a mixture of growing suburban areas and rural areas that contain stable and slightly increasing population growth.

Blair County is also very unique in that it has regular large-scale countywide drug sweeps conducted by the Attorney General's Office. The drug sweeps are in part financed by a community funded entity known as "Operation Our Town." The drug sweeps are primarily based out of the Altoona Police Department but include arrests and defendants throughout the County. Historically, since the inception of "Operation Our Town," these cases were regularly filed, pursuant to Administrative Orders, at the Magisterial District Courts of the City of Altoona.

Upon the closure of Magisterial District Court 24-1-01, the remaining two (2) city Magisterial District Courts absorbed its former wards. Due to the high caseload of the shopping district, President Judge Kopriva, on February 15, 2011, entered an Administrative Order providing that Pennsylvania State Police traffic cases along Interstate 99 in Logan Township and Allegheny Township would be filed at Magisterial District Court 24-3-01 (Tyrone). Additionally, all filings for the lower half of Tyrone Township would be filed in District Court 24-3-01(Tyrone).

Due to the combination of the recent closure of Magisterial District 24-1-01 and recent administrative Orders, it is not statistically possible to compare case filings and workload further back than 2011. Blair County's proposal is based upon taking actual 2011 filings through and including October 2011 to reach a total yearly filing for the year 2011. These figures were then used to formulate the proposal for Blair County.

Blair County proposes the following changes to realign each of these three (3) Magisterial Districts:

-Realign the lower half of Tyrone Township from Magisterial District Court 24-3-02 (Logan Township) to Magisterial District Court 24-3-01 (Tyrone).

-Realign the Borough of Duncansville from Magisterial District Court 24-3-02 (Logan Township) to Magisterial District Court 24-3-03 (Hollidaysburg).

Due to the unique makeup of Blair County, combined with the regular countywide drug sweeps, it is very difficult to further align the county to achieve caseload equity. Any further realignment options would significantly disrupt police services and seriously inconvenience the constituents of the Blair County Magisterial District Courts.

In addition to the proposed realignment, caseload equity can best be achieved through internal Administrative Orders that pose the ideal solution to Court participants, the constituents of Blair County and police services. Pennsylvania State Police traffic cases occurring on Interstate 99 in Logan Township (Magisterial District Court 24-3-02) will continue to be filed in Magisterial District Court 24-3-01 (Tyrone). Pennsylvania State Police traffic cases occurring on Interstate 99 in Allegheny Township (Magisterial District Court 24-3-02) will be filed in

Magisterial District Court 24-3-04 (Roaring Spring). As Interstate 99 bisects Blair County north to south, the continued use of an Administrative Order will benefit both the public at large and police services. All criminal and traffic cases filed by the Pennsylvania State Police that occur in the City of Altoona will be filed in Magisterial District Court 24-3-03 (Hollidaysburg).

Furthermore, to lessen the caseload filing and workload in the City of Altoona, the countywide "Operation Our Town" drug sweeps will be primarily handled by District Court 24-3-04 (Roaring Spring) with assistance provided by Magisterial District Court 24-3-03 (Hollidaysburg) and Magisterial District Court 24-3-02 (Tyrone).

With the proposed changes, the estimated caseload adjustment is as follows:

In summary, analysis indicates that, due to the unique makeup of the geographic and socioeconomic characteristics of Blair County, combined with the recent closure of Magisterial District Court 24-1-01, and the existence of regular countywide drug sweeps financially supported by a community-funded entity, the current proposal will best serve the judicial needs of the municipalities within their borders.

The proposal for Blair County was posted in the Blair County Courthouse and on the County website for public inspection on Monday, February 27, 2012 through March 29, 2012. Also, a press release conference was held Tuesday, February 28, 2012. No comments were received. Blair County proposes its realignment/reestablishment be effective on June 1, 2012.



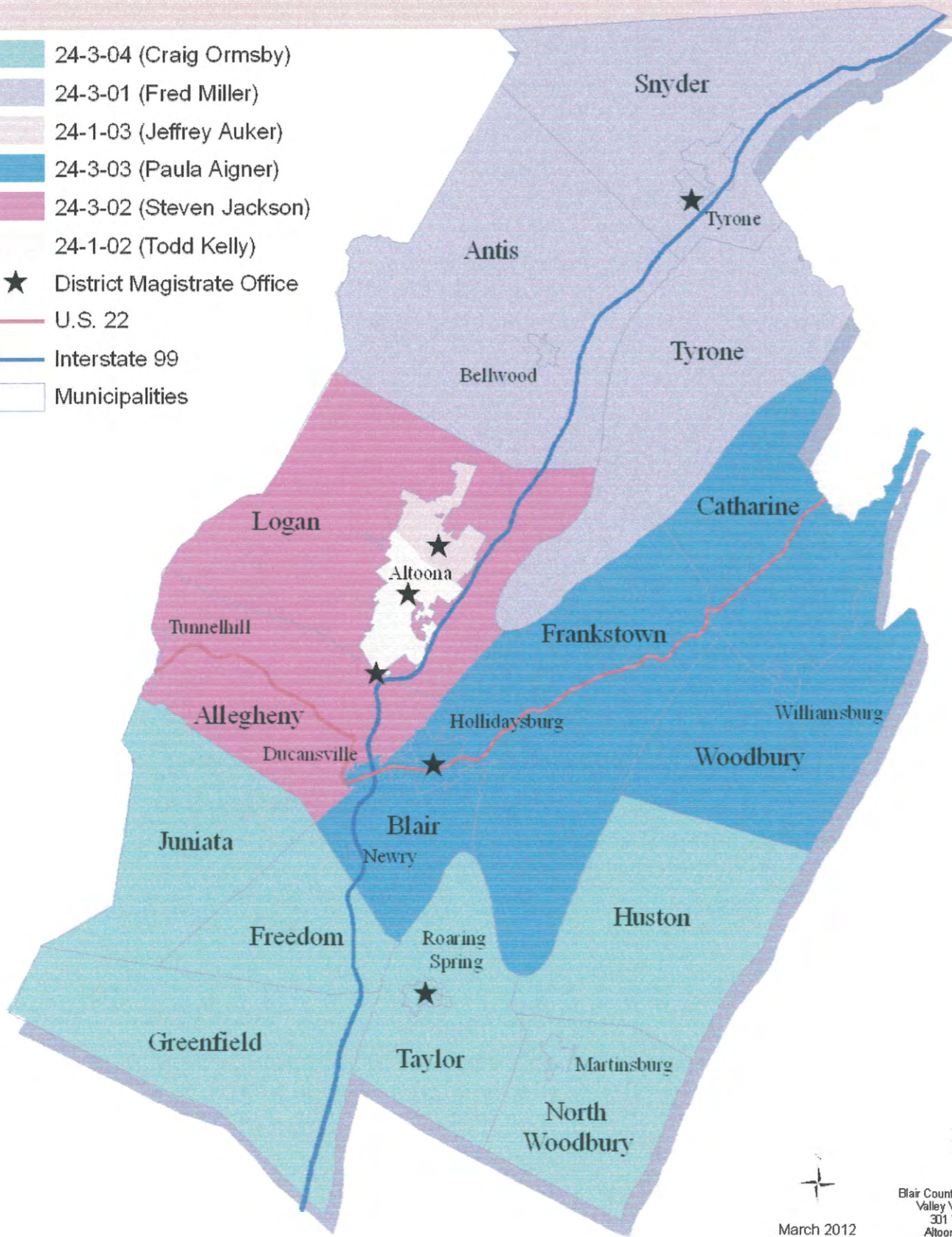

Merging District 24-3-04 with District 24-3-03 was considered; however, the resulting caseload would be 57% higher than the current average caseload and 39% higher than the current average workload in the 24 th District with an even larger disparity created with the other 5 th Class Counties.
