This document is submitted pursuant to a request for the re-establishment of magisterial district court boundaries as is statutorily required as a result of the 2010 census.

Bucks County continues to experience a population growth which was 10.4% between the years 1990 and 2000 and again a continued growth of 4.6% between the years of 2000 and 2010. The reported population for Bucks County in 2010 was 625,249.

During the previous redistricting process Bucks County was directed to add additional magisterial district courts considering the population growth and opening of a casino bordering the Philadelphia corridor. Two (2) courts were added, 07-1-12 & 07-3-02, and opened in January 2008. Also at that time boundaries were reconfigured for eight (8) of the previously established eighteen (18) magisterial districts within Bucks County. This balanced the case filings and workload of each of these courts as well as provided workload equity for all of the magisterial district courts within Bucks County.

During the last census interval the major growth pattern in Bucks County was in the central region. The population continues to migrate toward the northern portion of the county. Three (3) of the municipalities in the central portion of Bucks County increased their population over 30% and an additional four (4) municipalities increased over 20%.

Workload and case filing averages for the Bucks County district courts are in the top ten percentile for the Commonwealth. Having received, reviewed, and analyzed the profiled case

filings and caseload averages between the years of 2005 through 2010, our magisterial district courts are 10.3% above the average caseload for all 2A counties and 45% above the state average for all magisterial district courts. In viewing the average workload for the Bucks County district courts, Bucks County is 18% above the average for all 2A counties, 49% above the average for the state, 41% above Delaware County (2A county) and 12% above Montgomery County (2A county).


Attached hereto is supporting documentation and analysis of various factors which will support my recommendation that magisterial district courts not be added, deleted nor boundaries changed as a result of the most recent census and redistricting mandate.

I would note that attachments herein enclosed include three (3) court orders which I initiated to address the request from the Pennsylvania State Police and to fine tune the case filings and workload balance within the Bucks County magisterial district courts. You will find Pennsylvania State Police case filings have been assigned to reflect fewer courts for their agency to file within Bucks County. This reassignment was done carefully and has balanced the workload and case filings in the various magisterial district courts. These assignments are inclusive of criminal filings, traffic and non-traffic citations on the corridors of the Pennsylvania Turnpike, Interstate Route 95 and Milford Township in the northern tier of Bucks County.

I certify that each magisterial district court and respective magisterial district judge reside within the boundaries of the magisterial district to which the judge was elected. Individual certifications are also on file in this district.

I am very pleased with the workload balance within all of the magisterial district courts in Bucks County and can assure the Court that workload equity exists with appropriate accommodation to the various individuals and agencies served by the Bucks County magisterial district courts.

Although the percentage of average case load and average work load for this court in comparison to others within the judicial district average is higher than others, the information is somewhat skewed in that it includes information prior to the change in boundaries during 2008. In addition I would reference Appendix B whereby at the request of the PA State Police the filing courts were amended which placed filings from Interstate Route 95 into Courts 07-1-04 and 07-1-08 from the Philadelphia boundary to mile-post marker 40. This amendment has rebalanced the case filings and workload for this court as well as meeting the needs of the PA State Police in reducing the number of courts to which they attend hearings and filings of their citations and offenses. This court order became effective October 7, 2010 and is addressing the imbalance in case filing averages as shown above.

It was the request of Pennsylvania State Police that this apportionment of filings be initiated due to their logistics for the filing and attendance of proceedings by the Pennsylvania State Police officers. The workload average as compared to the judicial districts workload average is less; however this was adjusted in late 2010. I reference Appendix B which identifies this court has recently been reassigned Pennsylvania State Police filings from Interstate Route 95, the northbound section from the Philadelphia boundary to the milepost-marker 40. This occurred as a recommendation from the Pennsylvania State Police to limit the courts in which they file as well as to balance the case filings and workload of this magisterial district. I would note that the effective date for this change was December 1, 2010, thus in the profiles as identified in this section they have yet to be adjusted or corrected because of the timing of this implementation.

This magisterial district recently increased case filings and continues to incrementally increase in 2011. There were 5630 (year 2010) filings (approximately 400 cases more than the prior year). This district is within 9% of the class 2A county average for case filings and with 4% of the workload for an average class 2A workload. This district covers two municipalities in entirety; during the last ten years the Borough of Ivyland had a population increase of nearly 112% and Warminster Township increased over 4%. Within this magisterial district there are significant pockets of low income communities which increase the court's time with payment determination hearings, truancy hearings, warrant purges and language communications. This magisterial district is on the casino traffic pattern corridor and traffic filings are anticipated to increase.

Based upon the continued growth patterns of this magisterial district, the current caseload and workload so associated, no recommendation is being made to change boundaries or realignment of this magisterial district.

This court is a busy court as the average caseload is profiled to be in the mid 8,000 category. During the past two years a concentrated effort has been made to reduce this caseload and was accomplished by the court order which I can refer to as Appendix B. This reallocates Pennsylvania State Police filings from the Route 95 corridor. Cases have been transferred from this venue to other courts (07-1-08 & 07-1-07) as referred in Appendix B of this document. Currently for year 2010 the case filings were reduced by nearly 600 filings and it is anticipated based on the numbers received so far in 2011 that the case filings will drop from the total average approximately 1100 cases annually. This then puts this court well within the average range for caseload and workload averages as well as workload equity for the judge and staff associated to this magisterial district. As mentioned previously Appendix B was created as a result of a request of the Pennsylvania State Police as well as the court's desire to better balance the case filings in this court. It was the appropriate action to be taken and has now balanced the filings in not only this magisterial district but other surrounding magisterial districts.

No realignment or boundary changes are recommended for this magisterial district.

This rural magisterial district profiled below the caseload averages and workload averages in comparison to 2A county total averages for the years 2005 through 2010. It is noted the court order, Appendix A (September 2010) reflects a transfer of Pennsylvania State Police cases (approximately 1500 cases annually) from Milford Township in magisterial district 07-2-05 to magisterial district 07-2-03. This now allows an almost perfect balance of case filings between these two magisterial districts. Each court currently approximates just over 6000 cases annually. It should be noted that consideration of this reassignment of Pennsylvania State Police cases also encompasses the knowledge that Milford Township has grown 12.4% within the past ten years, Richland Township has grown nearly 32% in the past ten years and West Rockhill Township has grown 24.2% within the past ten years. It was thus appropriate and necessary to balance these workloads knowing the populations for which these courts serve have grown and will continue to grow. Based upon the filings and workload of these districts as of November 2011, no changes in boundaries are recommended for this magisterial district.

Although the average workload is lower than other districts within this county, the numeric computation does not accurately reflect the workload of this district. Based upon the stability and consistency of filings in this magisterial district as well as the anticipated growth within Newtown and Wrightstown Townships, it is recommended that no realignment occur in this magisterial district.

This district's total average workload approximates the 2A county figures. This magisterial district includes municipalities that continue to increase in population. Solebury Township's population increased in excess of 12% and Buckingham Township increased more than 22% during the last ten years. It was due to the significant increase in population/case filings during the last realignment of this magisterial district that Warwick Township was moved from this venue to a newly established district (07-3-02, January 2008). The realignment of Warwick Township in 2008 has better balanced the workload and caseload of this district to be more similar to other districts in the county. Based upon the current workload average and the anticipated future filings at this district, no recommendations are made for changing the boundaries of this magisterial district.

Although the filings and workload are somewhat less than the average for the other districts within this 2A county, it is noted that this is the most northern rural region of Bucks County, containing a lake, a public gameland area and in total approximately 175 square miles. During the last realignment implementation in 2008, the Township of Plumstead was added to this venue to address appropriate filings, balancing of caseload and the workload in this district. This magisterial district contains Bedminster Township, population increase of 36.8% during the last ten years and Plumstead Township which grew 9.1% in the past ten years. Bucks County has 20 magisterial district courts located throughout Bucks County inclusive of the 20 judges and approximately 113 judicial clerks. Magisterial district courts are responsible for adjudicating all traffic and non-traffic citations as well as processing criminal and private criminal complaints inclusive of arraignments and preliminary hearings, the handling of civil and landlord tenant complaints up to a jurisdictional limit of \$12,000 as well as parking violations.

The Bucks County district courts handle approximately 130,000 cases annually, receipt approximately \$16,000,000 and process approximately 10,000 criminal cases annually.

Magisterial district judge's jurisdiction in criminal cases includes parking violations through other summary and misdemeanor and felony offenses including the initial phases of murder offenses. All misdemeanor and felony violations are more commonly called court cases. These categories of cases are filed in the district courts where they are preliminarily arraigned and afforded a preliminary hearing. At the conclusion of the preliminary hearing the charges are dismissed, waived to court or held for court and referred onto the Court of Common Pleas.

Magisterial district judges, as officers of the Pennsylvania Unified Judicial System, may administer oaths and affirmations and take acknowledgements. They also have authority to perform marriages. It is up to the individual judge's decision whether he or she wishes to perform marriage ceremonies as there is no legally prescribed form for a wedding ceremony so religious services and vows conform to the secular content in which they are used. Recently magisterial district courts

transitioned to the Epay system for the payment of fines and costs at all of the magisterial district courts. This allows an individual to pay fines, costs, restitution, collateral etc. online from any internet connected computer or from the lobby of the magisterial district court. 




Dear President Judge McAndrews:

After review of the Bucks County magisterial district reestablishment proposal, the Supreme Court has not accepted your proposal. The Court requests that you resubmit your proposal and address the Court's concerns.

Specifically, the Court believes that the number of magisterial districts in Bucks County should be increased by at least one district, if not two districts. The average annual caseload per District Justice in Bucks County is 6344, compared with 5760 filings per District Justice for all Class 2A counties and 3953 filings per District Justice statewide. This, coupled with the 10.4% population increase Bucks County has experienced over the last ten years, leads the Court to believe that an increase in the number of District Justices in the county is warranted. The fact that one of your magisterial districts is more than 70% above the county average caseload is further evidence that additional magisterial districts are required. The Court did not find adequate the justification that you gave in your proposal for maintaining the districts in their current configuration.

Please submit your revised proposal for Bucks County no later than Monday, March 3, 2003 to Joseph J. Mittleman, Director of Judicial Programs, Suite 1414, 1515 Market St., Philadelphia, PA 19102. We understand and appreciate all of the hard work that has gone into this process. The Court, however, believes that concerns for the efficient administration of justice and for a unified approach to reestablishment requires that some additional work be done in order to assure caseload equity. Thank you for your prompt attention to this matter.

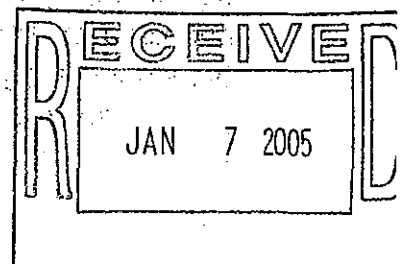
Dear President Judge Heckler:

Dear Justice Castille:

Thanks very much for speaking with me this past Wednesday about the possibility of delaying execution of the Supreme Court's Order for Realignment of Magisterial Districts in Bucks County. As we discussed, the present effective date of the Order would require the County to expend at minimum roughly \$362,000 within the next year in order to create two new district justice courts in our County. As I discussed with you, I wish to request a two-year delay in the implementation of the Court's Order. This would result in the two new judicial positions created being filled by election in 2007 and their courts commencing operation in January 2008.

I advance in support of this request two considerations. The first is the fact that, despite handling case loads which significantly exceed the norms adopted by the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts, our Bucks County district justices have been discharging their duties in a thorough and timely fashion. I am confident that they will be able to do so using existing court facilities for the next three years. The second consideration and the motivator for this request is the economic bind in which Bucks County government presently finds itself. I won't dwell at length upon the history of events which have brought Bucks County to this juncture. I will observe that the inability of the County Commissioners to rely upon any source but the assessed value of real estate as a tax base, the explosive residential growth in our County and the fact that this growth has generally not been accompanied by similar rates of expansion in commercial or industrial tax rates all contribute to the problem. This, coupled with a choice made long ago to assess real estate at 25% of actual market value, has substantially limited the resources available to the Commissioners to fund County

government. The practical problem faced by the Commissioners in raising the needed tax revenues is exacerbated by the fact that the explosive residential growth, recently occurring particularly in the central part of our County, has led to the building of a great many public schools, which as you know are also funded chiefly by taxes levied on the assessed value of real estate.

The Commissioners have recently adopted a new system of real estate assessment which values properties at 100% of actual value. This represents a first step toward gathering the funds required to adequately fund necessary County services but, because of a limit on revenues which may be generated as a result, does not provide an instant solution to the short-term liquidity problem faced by the County. Given the fact that the Court and the Commissioners are together contemplating the construction of a sorely needed new justice center to house County Court functions, I want to do as much as I responsibly can to allow the County to get through its short-term cash flow difficulties without clobbering Bucks County homeowners.

My concern for the taxpayers and the Commissioners notwithstanding, I would not make this recommendation if I believed for one minute that the ability of Bucks County's district courts to perform their mission would be compromised thereby. Our capable administrative staff regularly analyzes the workload of our existing district courts and recommends remedial action, assigning certain categories of work from some of the busier district courts to those with lighter dockets. Actions taken to date have been the transfer of cases generated in Upper Southampton Township from Magisterial District 07-1-06 to District 07-2-01 and the transfer of all criminal dockets arising in Plumstead Township from Magisterial District 07-3-01 to District 07-3-03. We have also transferred all Pennsylvania State Police traffic filings arising from their patrol activities along Route 95 from Magisterial District 07-1-01 to District 07-1-02 and from District 07-1-07 to District 07-1-04. These changes, made some months ago, have resulted in a significant leveling of the overall workload. We are currently reviewing a plan for further remedial action to relocate case filings in Magisterial Districts 07-2-02 and 07-3-01.

As noted above, our district justice courts are currently managing their caseloads in a timely fashion and the district justices who have communicated with me express a strong desire to continue with the existing configuration of magisterial districts. If the Supreme Court will be good enough to allow us this two-year delay in implementation, I am prepared to reassign staff as necessary to assure that our busiest district justice courts keep up with the cases they receive. I am confident that we can handle the anticipated caseloads for the next three years, even anticipating the opening of a gambling casino at the Philadelphia Racetrack, an event which will likely not occur until late next year at the earliest. My staff and I currently monitor the monthly activities of our district justice courts. I enclose a statistical extract of the caseloads of each of our district courts for the past four years and through July of this year for your reference. The ability to monitor current caseloads and the flexibility to temporarily reassign certain

classes of cases and support personnel has given us the ability to successfully manage District Justice workloads.

In closing, let me thank you for your willingness to consider this request. Let me also assure you that this is a once and done proposition. Should the effect of the Supreme Court's Order be delayed for two years, there will be no future requests from me for further delay in implementation, for reconsideration of the configuration of any magisterial district or anything else of this sort, so help me, amen. Naturally, if you have any questions or further concerns, I will be more than happy to attempt to provide any additional information you or your staff may require or to meet with you or anyone else you deem appropriate at your convenience.

Thanks again for your consideration.

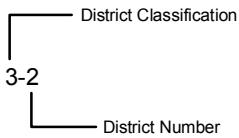
