INTRODUCTION

In October 2011, the Twentieth Judicial District, Huntingdon County, was notified by the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts (AOPC) of its requirement under 42 Pa. C.S.A. § 1503, to participate in the reestablishment of magisterial districts. This event occurs every ten years and is directly related to the Federal decennial census. The following factors were taken into consideration during the development of this plan: guidelines as set forth by AOPC, case filing statistics and work load statistics for Criminal, Non-Traffic, Private Complaint, Traffic, Civil, Landlord/Tenant and Miscellaneous filings in the four Magisterial District Courts in Huntingdon County, as well as population of individual municipalities in each district.

This document has been posted on line at <http://www.huntingdoncounty.net> (see news releases), in the individual magisterial district judge's offices within Huntingdon County, the office of the Huntingdon County Commissioners and the Court Administrator's office in the Huntingdon County Courthouse, 223 Penn Street, Huntingdon, Pennsylvania.

Dear Judge Kurtz:

My comments and concerns regarding the above-referenced proposed plan are offered as a citizen of the Huntingdon County and a resident of Huntingdon Borough, not as a magisterial district judge. Of course a substantial part of my understanding of the issues involved in this plan is derived from my office as magisterial district judge in District 20-3-02 (District 02); nevertheless, the proposed plan will affect my fellow Huntingdon County residents and me long after I have retired from office.

My comments are as follows:

1. The proposed reestablishment plan would result in unnecessary and substantial Inconvenience to the residents of District 20-3-02.

The proposed plan shifts Miller, Oneida, Walker, Penn, Lincoln, Hopewell and Henderson Townships, along with Marklesburg Borough, to District 20-3-01 (District 01).

Based upon the figures shown in attachment C of the proposed plan, if District 02 were to retain Henderson, Hopewell, Lincoln, Miller, Oneida, Penn and Walker Townships, as well as Marklesburg Borough, the percentage of the workload would only shift as follows from the plan (excluding 1% which is split up in tenths between the three (3) remaining districts):

20-3-01 From 30% to 28%--change of minus 2%

20-3-02 From 33% to 34%--change of plus 1%

20-3-04 No Change

I submit that retaining these municipalities in District 02 would not deviate from the requirements set forth in the AOPC guidelines and that it would prevent significant and unnecessary confusion and inconvenience (AOPC Guidelines--Analysis paragraph 7h) for the residents of the affected municipalities, many of whom would literally drive past the magisterial court in District 2 while driving an additional round trip of sixteen (16) miles to get to the magisterial court in Alexandria. There is really no reason to alter the judicial landscape for these municipalities, which have been a part of District 02 since the inception of the district justice system.

2. Inconvenience Due to Separate School Districts (Guidelines—Analysis paragraph 7h).

I would note also that with the exception of Hopewell Township, all of these municipalities are located within the Huntingdon Area School District. There is an elementary school in Walker Township. After decades of having school related issues decided in a magisterial court located within the Huntingdon Area School District, the proposed plan would send those cases out of the Huntingdon Area School District to a magisterial court located in the Juniata Valley School District. Tangentially, one of the beneficial features of the proposed reestablishment plan is to bring Brady Township and Mill Creek Borough into Magisterial District 2. Both of those municipalities are included in the Huntingdon Area School District.

Thank you for your attention to and consideration of these comments.
