Enclosed is the proposed Redistricting Plan for Magisterial Districts in Northampton County. A committee (of which MDJ Elwell is a member) met numerous times to discuss and analyze the data for Northampton County. Although we discussed several different options, the plan as you see it, makes the most sense for Northampton County.

Because we did not meet the formula of being a judicial district that had a caseload that was 10% above the average caseload for third class judicial districts, we are a candidate to eliminate a magisterial district. We then had to look at the workload in each magisterial district and try to create workload equity among the magisterial districts. The plan combines two magisterial districts into one magisterial district, realigns nine magisterial districts and reestablishes five magisterial districts.

I've also enclosed an analysis of the data (as per instructions from the AOPC) and maps of what the magisterial districts will look like, if the plan is approved. The data for Northampton County may be found on the AOPC's website.

Please send any comments you may have in writing to me by December 21, 2011. The committee will review any comments received and take them into consideration, however; we can't guarantee that your comments will cause a change to the plan.

RE: Comments on Proposed Redistricting Plan

I am asking that reconsideration be given to the current re-districting plan provided to you by President Judge Kimberly McFadden. In 2010, the PA Supreme Court indicated to the respective county President Judges that one Magisterial District Judge office per county or 55 statewide must close by December 31, 2015. It was strongly encouraged via memorandum from Zigmont Pines to create a re-districting plan that did not create a situation whereby incumbent Magisterial District Judges are forced to run for re-election against each other. The current Northampton County plan creates this very unfortunate situation between District Court (DC) 03-2-07 and DC 03-3-01. Since notification of the re-districting mandate, President Judge McFadden has had three opportunities to close District Court offices through attrition vs. having incumbent Magisterial District Judges run against each other in re-election. They are as follows: 1) DC 03-2-12 had a vacant Magisterial District Judge from 2009 through 2011, which was filled on a temporary basis with Senior Magisterial District Judges until the term expired in 2011; 2) DC 03-3-02 had a Magisterial District Judge retire in 2011; and 3) DC 03-2-03 Magisterial District Judge has given notice in 2011 of planned retirement in 2015. This office could be closed, thus meeting the state mandate and abiding by the request to not create a situation where incumbent Magisterial District Judge's need to run against each other for re-election. However, President Judge McFadden has opted to not close the DC 03-2-03 office and re-distribute caseload, but is willing to close the District Court with the lowest caseload. Therefore, she has knowingly created an incumbent competitive re-election for the Magisterial District Judge's in DC 03-3-01 and DC 03-2-07.

In reviewing the statistics for each District Court office, I would be remiss if I did not address the situation of DC 03-2-07's caseload more than 10% below the state average. Understandably, consideration should be given to this statistic for counties where there is no Magisterial District Judge who is in the position to retire. However, three opportunities did present in Northampton County during this six-year transition period to eliminate a District Court office through attrition. The below mentioned proposed plan suggests to eliminate DC 03-2-03 through attrition and strategically re-align the surrounding DC voting tracts purposefully so that the caseload is increased to an acceptable level meeting or exceeding the state average. This proposed re-districting plan creates a "win-win" situation for DC 03-3-01 and DC 03-2-07 ultimately eliminating the unnecessary competitive re-election circumstance. I believe this proposed plan to be fair and

equitable for all Northampton County Magisterial District Judges. I am asking that consideration be given to this newly proposed plan for implementation.

The proposed redistricting plan suggests to:

- Eliminate DC 03-2-03
- Remain the unchanged DC's 03-3-03; 03-2-05; 03-2-12; 03-2-06; 03-2-01; 03-2-10; 03-2-11; 03-02-04
- Re-align DC's 03-1-04; 03-3-01; 03-3-02; 03-2-08; 03-2-09; 03-2-07

The re-alignment suggestions are as follows:

- DC 03-1-04- Remove Hanover Township Districts 3 and 6.
- DC 03-2-07- Northampton Borough, North Catasauqua Borough, Allen Township, East Allen Township, Lower Nazareth District 1, Bethlehem Township Districts 1-3 and 1-1, Hanover Township Districts 3 and 6.
- DC 03-2-08- Nazareth Borough, Lower Nazareth District 2, Bethlehem Township Districts 1-2, 1-2H, 2-1H, 2-2, 2-3H, 3-1, 3-2, 3-3, 3-4, 3-4H, 4-1.
- DC 03-2-09- Remove Tatamy Borough, add Bethlehem Township Districts 4-2 and 4-3.
- DC 03-3-01- Lehigh Township, Moore Township, Upper Nazareth Township West, Walnutport Borough, Bath Borough, and Chapman Borough.
- DC 03-2-02- Bushkill Township, Stockertown, Tatamy Borough, Upper Nazareth Township East, Wind Gap Borough, Plainfield Township Districts Church and Kesslerville.





Dear MDJ Hawke:

I have reviewed your letter received by Debra French on February 7, 2012 regarding the proposed redistricting plan.

Please be reminded that the redistricting plan that was proposed for Northampton County was devised by a Committee, including a member of the Magisterial District Judges' Association, after consideration with three (3) Common Pleas Judges who participated in the process. The result reflects the view of the Committee as a whole.

The Plan that was proposed per the AOPC's guidelines was created after receiving those guidelines in late October of 2011. Prior to that time, there was not a concrete plan with parameters that the Court had to consider. We believe as a Committee that the proposal makes the most sense by eliminating a magisterial district with a low caseload/workload. It further creates caseload/workload redistribution in contiguous magisterial districts. As you know, the AOPC guidelines for the redistricting plan require the balancing of workloads among the magisterial districts. Your plan seems to ignore that requirement. Our redistricting plan addresses the workload issue between our district courts.

It was not the intention, nor the desire, to have incumbent MDJ's running against each other in future elections. The Committee worked and reworked the numbers according to the AOPC guidelines and determined that the best option was to eliminate a magisterial district that had the lowest caseload. Your suggestion that District 03-2-03 should be eliminated would result in the elimination of the office with the fourth highest caseload in the county and the third highest workload in the judicial district, in addition to not providing more balanced caseloads and workloads

in other districts.

Again, your letter and this response will be included in the packet that is sent to the AOPC. We will await their directive.
