

PUBLIC COMMENT RECEIVED IN RE: MDJ REALIGNMENT

The Tioga County Bar Association and the Tioga County Law Enforcement Association both indicated that the elimination of a magisterial district judge in Tioga County would be a great hardship to the members of their organizations.

The Secretary of the Roseville Boro, which was being considered for reassignment to Magisterial District #04-3-01, indicated that the 35 mile trip, one way (@45 minutes), would be a great hardship to the Boro's citizens.

Magisterial District Judge James Carlson, #04-3-03, received several calls from the citizens of Roseville Boro, requesting that they not be transferred to another district. Judge Carlson felt it appropriate to leave this boro in his district.
