The following summary is to provide explanation for Question II.E.i. and III.C.i. of the AOPC Magisterial District Reestablishment Worksheet for ALL Magisterial District Courts in Judicial District 19.

Judicial District 19, York County as a whole has a 23% higher Caseload Average and a 40% higher Workload Average than the State. We are ranked 9<sup>th</sup> in Average Caseload in the State (including Allegheny and after 2 counties figures were revised due to eliminations) and 6<sup>th</sup> in the State in Average Workload (again including Allegheny, and after recalculation of eliminated courts in 2 counties.) According to the 2010 U.S. Census, York County's population growth was 8<sup>th</sup> among the State.

With that, District Court 19-3-02 was eliminated in it's current political venue due to a severely disproportionate caseload/workload value and moved to another venue to be re-established as District Court 19-3-11 to accommodate a severe overage in District Court 19-2-01 and District Court 19-2-04. The following Courts were then realigned. The political boundary for District Court 19-2-01 was reduced to Springettsbury Township. District Court 19-2-04 was reduced to Manchester Township. The political boundary was increased for District Court 19-3-01 to include Chanceford Township and Felton Borough while District Court 19-3-03 was adjusted to include Lower Chanceford and Peach Bottom Townships along with Delta Borough. District Court 19-3-06 added Jackson and Paradise Townships along with Spring Grove Borough to increase a substandard caseload while providing relief for District Court 19-3-07 whose caseload was also well above the State average. District Court 19-3-07 was then reestablished with the addition of Conewago Township to decrease the overage in District Court 19-3-09. District Court 19-3-11 will encompass East Manchester and Hellam Townships along with the Boroughs of Hallam, Manchester, Mount Wolf and Wrightsville. The remaining District Courts 19-1-01, 19-1-02, 19-1-03, 19-1-04, 19-1-05, 19-2-02, 19-2-03- 19-2-05, 19-3-04, 19-3-05 and 19-3-10 were re-established as existing. Finally to further reduce the excessive overages in Courts along the busy sections of the I-83 corridor, a local Court Order established by the President Judge was issued to assign ALL Pennsylvania State Police dockets to three (3) specific District Courts 19-3-03, 19-3-04 and 19-3-10 to increase their respective caseload while further lowering the caseload in Courts 19-2-01, 19-2-02, 19-2-04 and 19-3-09.

In view of the increase in Population, the current/projected Caseload and corresponding Workload Averages, our reestablishment/realignment plan will NOT provide relief for this Judicial District whose averages will still be significantly higher than the States as indicated above. While the statistics provided indicate the need for an additional Court to bring us in compliance with the recommended average caseload and subsequent workload, we understand the financial circumstances that face the State and the Supreme Court. Although there will continue to be some inequities, we acknowledge the plan the Supreme Court approved for our reestablishment/realignment is the most comprehensive design to streamline the caseload and paralleling workload to provide for a balanced approach for the next decade.
