The difference between the average annual caseload of Judicial District # 5 and its class of county: **0 %**

1. The Fifth Judicial District has realized a 26% reduction in judicial officers over the last nine years. Effective January 2012, two districts were eliminated. The county has a current total of 46 magisterial district judges.
2. Not in favor of eliminating or reconfiguring courts that are within appropriate range and not expected to change in the near future. Geographic constraints, court and MDJ residence location inhibit some potential eliminations or realignments.

District court 05-0-04 (arraignment court) and 05-0-03 (Pittsburgh Municipal Court) are managed by a full time administrator.

05-0-04 serves as the 24/7 court for the judicial district. Judges with some or all municipalities located within the City of Pittsburgh sit in this court using a schedule based on caseload of each office (schedule is not rotated equally). There are two sessions daily; and conduct preliminary arraignments, issue search and arrest warrants, accept criminal complaints, set and accept bail and emergency PFA petitions. This court also hears continuances and waivers for matters arising in the City of Pittsburgh when the Pittsburgh Municipal Court needs assistance. All MDJs are in rotation for weekend, and holiday duty. This court has four support personnel Monday through Friday and fourteen support personnel assisting in evening, weekend and holiday shifts.

05-0-03 - Pittsburgh Municipal Court (PMC): assumes all misdemeanor and felony offenses, including private criminal complaints arising from within the corporate limits of the City of Pittsburgh, including parking citations (excluding Pittsburgh Parking Authority) and non-traffic summary offenses. By local rule, this is also the designated central site for filing and conducting preliminary hearings for all Act 22 complaints arising in Allegheny County, as well as all homicide cases county-wide. PMC is covered by 13 MDJs on a rotating basis, Monday through Friday, for two sessions daily. Including the administrator, 31 employees are assigned to PMC Monday through Friday.

The president judge is committed to using the AOPC workload measures to schedule MDJs in PMC and Arraignment Court upon approval of the plan.

General Comments

- 1. Allegheny is the only second class county and does not have a point of comparison to other counties within the Commonwealth.*
- 2. Comprised of rural and urban areas. There are 130 municipalities, 44 public school districts and 109 municipal police departments.*
- 3. Magisterial districts have low-income areas where a decreasing population yields an increase in casefilings. Public transportation county-wide has also been reduced.*

Because Ross Township surrounds West View Borough, there is no other municipality that is contiguous. Both are declining in population. 75% of filings are attributed to Ross Township, which, if split, would cause a burden to police and school district. West View Borough is too small to justify its own district.

By administrative order, this court presides over cases filed by the Insurance Fraud Section of the Office of Attorney General, Allegheny County and the Auto Theft Prosecution Unit and Insurance Fraud Prosecution Unit of the District Attorney, Allegheny County.

The MDJ also serves as Chairman of the PCCD Constable Education Training Board and other court related committees.

<p>The Fifth Judicial District is composed solely of Allegheny County. Allegheny County has a land area of 730.2 square miles and a population of 1,223,348. It is a county of contrasts, with both urban and rural aspects. Coke barges still share the waterways with a vibrant, recreational waterfront. Having survived the decline of the steel industry, the county is now known for its hospitals, universities and industrial centers. It is still home to the headquarters of numerous Fortune 500 corporations. The confluence in the City of Pittsburgh of the Monongahela and Allegheny Rivers forming the Ohio River represent a vast watershed of tributaries that create topography of steep hills and slopes and necessitates over 2,000 bridges and tunnels in the county.</p>	
<p>Allegheny County has 130 municipalities, including a second class city, three (3) third class cities and 126 municipalities. There are 44 public school districts in Allegheny County. In addition, there are 109 municipal police departments. Other active law enforcement agencies filing criminal charges in the county include, among others, the Allegheny County Police Department, the Pennsylvania State Police, the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board, Attorney General Investigations Unit, Allegheny County District</p>

Attorney Investigations Unit, the Allegheny County Sheriff's Office, the Pennsylvania Fish and Game Commission, Port Authority Police, Allegheny County Housing Authority Police and numerous university police departments.

While the comparison for caseload purposes of counties from the same class of county provides a measurement geared towards uniformity in county population ranges, it is undeniable that the judicial and staff activity involved in any particular type of filing is identical, absent local rule variations, in all classes of counties as dictated by state statutory and procedural rule authority. Allegheny County is the only Second Class County in Pennsylvania, and has a vastly larger population than any other county with magisterial district courts, it is noteworthy that Allegheny County's average caseload is 6,371 (See Exhibit A) which is 26% higher than the state-wide average, and average workload is 63,514 (See Exhibit B) which is 81% higher than the state-wide average, according to the AOPC Average Filings and Workload by County and Class of County, revised 11/16/2011.

It is beyond cavil that parity among all district courts is not attainable. The Fifth Judicial District has district courts in low-income areas with decreasing populations where filings are down and district courts in low-income areas with decreasing populations where filings are up. Recent severe cuts in public transportation with more in the offing for 2012 paint a dire picture for the residents of Allegheny County. In 2011, forty-five (45) bus routes were entirely eliminated and weekday service was reduced for ninety-four (94) other bus and trolley routes. Currently, the Port Authority of Allegheny County is scheduled in March of 2012 to eliminate another twenty-nine (29) bus and trolley routes and thirty-seven (37) others are slated for reduced schedules.

The Fifth Judicial District is loath to reconfigure courts that maintain appropriate caseload and/or workload statistics and no discernible changes forecasted for the near future. Many of the cascading realignments that would result in attempting to equalize caseload and/or workload would still result in disproportionate allocations of cases and work. Geographic constraints, the locations of the established court and the magisterial district judge's residence inhibit realignment and elimination options. Some of the Magisterial District Reestablishment Worksheets explicitly describe the factors that preclude elimination and/or realignment. However, every court with averages above or below the 15% midpoint workload figure have been evaluated for potential realignment or elimination. (See Exhibit J).

The Fifth Judicial District is acutely aware of the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania's deep concerns regarding the judiciary's budget situation and the need to allocate precious judicial resources in the most responsible and effective manner. However, it is imperative that consideration be given to the fact that, from January of 2003 to January of 2012, the Fifth Judicial District has realized a 26% reduction in judicial officers who comprise the minor judiciary for Allegheny County. In December of 2002, there were sixty-one (61) members of the minor judiciary: fifty-five (55) elected magisterial district judges (then known as district justices) and six (6) City of Pittsburgh magistrates, appointed by the mayor of the City of Pittsburgh to serve as the judicial officers of Pittsburgh Magistrates Court. Pursuant to the Amended Order of the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania, No. 192 Magisterial Docket No. 1, eight (8) district courts were eliminated and one (1) new district court was established. (See Exhibit K). Further, at the request of the President Judge, this Order suspended the appointment or reappointment of Pittsburgh City Magistrates and authorized the President Judge to assign district judges to Pittsburgh Magistrates Court until such time as the evaluation of the transitioning of Pittsburgh Magistrates Court to the statewide district justice system was completed. At No. 212 Magisterial Docket No. 1, the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania ordered the establishment of Pittsburgh Municipal Court, transitioning the Pittsburgh Magistrates Court into the statewide district justice system. (See Exhibit L). This Order, effective January 1, 2005, directed the President Judge to assign, on a rotating basis, the elected district justices of the Fifth Judicial District to hear the matters formerly heard in Pittsburgh Magistrates Court by the six (6) appointed magistrates. This brought the number of minor judiciary in Allegheny County to a total forty-eight (48). The Supreme Court of Pennsylvania, at No. 271 Magisterial Rules Docket, issued an Order granting the request of the President Judge to eliminate District Court 05-2-09 and District Court 05-2-46, effective January 2, 2012. (See Exhibits M, N and O). The Fifth Judicial District currently has forty-six (46) magisterial district judges.

Arraignment Court (District Court 05-0-04) Pursuant to Rule 117 of the Pa.R.Crim.P. and Rule 117.1 of All.C.R.Crim. P., Arraignment Court, located in the Municipal Courts Building with Pittsburgh Municipal Court (District Court 05-0-03) serves as the 24/7 court for the Fifth Judicial District. (See Exhibit P.) All magisterial district judges of the Fifth Judicial District serve in Arraignment Court. During regular court hours and business days, magisterial district judges whose districts, include in whole or in part, the City of Pittsburgh, sit in this court based upon a schedule devised by the Administrator of Pittsburgh Municipal Court, based upon caseload statistics. Consequently, the caseload of Pittsburgh Municipal Court is not evenly apportioned among the thirteen (13) magisterial district judges presiding in Arraignment Court. There are two sessions each day (morning session is 8:30 AM to noon and afternoon session is 1:00 PM to 5:00 PM). The magisterial district judges in Arraignment Court conduct preliminary arraignments, issue search and arrest warrants, accept criminal complaints, set and accept bail for matters throughout Allegheny County and emergency Protection From Abuse petitions from 3:00PM to 5:00 PM. They also handle preliminary hearing continuances and waivers for matters arising within the City of Pittsburgh when the magisterial district judges sitting in Pittsburgh Municipal Court are in need of assistance.

All magisterial district judges are also in rotation at Arraignment Court for Saturday, Sunday and court Holidays. During weekends and holidays, there are three (3) judicial officer shifts at Arraignment Court: 8:30 AM to 4:30 PM, 4:30 PM to 12:30 AM and 12:30 AM to 8:30AM. For 365 days a year, the 12:30 AM to 8:30 AM shift (or midnight to 8:00AM Monday through Friday) is covered solely by senior magisterial district judges. Thirty-three magisterial district judges (those whose districts do not include any portion of the City of Pittsburgh) cover the single shift Monday through Friday from 6:00PM to midnight.

There are fourteen (14) support personnel who are assigned to evening/holiday/weekend shifts of Arraignment Court. Four (4) support personnel are assigned to the Monday through Friday, regular business hours in Arraignment Court.

Pittsburgh Municipal Court (District Court 05-0-03) Pittsburgh Municipal Court assumes all misdemeanor and felony offenses, including private criminal complaints, arising within the corporate limits of the City of Pittsburgh; all traffic offenses arising within the corporate limits of the City of Pittsburgh, including City of Pittsburgh police parking citations, but excluding parking tickets and citations issued by agents of the Pittsburgh Parking Authority; all non-traffic summary offenses, arising within the corporate limits of the City of Pittsburgh. In addition, Pittsburgh Municipal Court is designated by local rule, Rule 131.2 of All.C.R.Crim.P., to serve as the central site for filing and conduct of preliminary hearings for all Act 33 complaints arising in Allegheny County. (See Exhibit Q.) Pittsburgh Municipal Court is also designated as the central site for all homicide cases, arising in Allegheny County. (See Exhibit R.) Any magisterial district judges wishing to sit as issuing authority for homicide cases must participate in a training seminar for this assignment. Currently, twenty-eight (28) magisterial district judges have qualified for this assignment.

Pittsburgh Municipal Court is covered by the thirteen (13) magisterial district judges whose district courts include, in whole or in part, wards of the City of Pittsburgh on a rotating basis Monday through Friday for two sessions each day with a morning session from 8:30AM to Noon or the completion of the morning list and 1:00PM to 4:30PM or the completion of the afternoon list. The administrator for Pittsburgh Municipal Court schedules the magisterial district judges for Pittsburgh Municipal Court based upon caseloads of the thirteen (13) magisterial district judges. Consequently, the substantial caseload of Pittsburgh Municipal Court is not evenly apportioned among the thirteen (13) magisterial district judges presiding in Pittsburgh Municipal Court.

Including the administrator of Pittsburgh Municipal Court, there are thirty-one (31) employees who are assigned to Pittsburgh Municipal Court Monday through Friday from 8:30AM to 4:30PM.

This proposal does include reducing the number of magisterial district judges covering the morning and afternoon sessions, Monday through Friday, in Pittsburgh Municipal Court and Arraignment Court from thirteen (13) to twelve (12). The realignment of District Court 03-3-06 is critical and the magisterial district judge of District Court 05-2-43 only serves in Pittsburgh Municipal Court a total of fourteen (14) half day sessions each year.

Utilizing the midpoint average caseload, there is a range among the City of Pittsburgh magisterial district courts from 0% to -89% below the midpoint average total caseload for the Fifth Judicial District (See Exhibit I.) Using the midpoint average workload, there is a range among the City of Pittsburgh magisterial district courts from -16% to -73% below the midpoint average total workload for the Fifth Judicial District. (See Exhibit J.)

Should the Fifth Judicial District's Reestablishment Plan be approved, the President Judge is committed to directing the Administrator of Pittsburgh Municipal Court and Arraignment Court to employ the AOPC-developed workload formula to schedule all judicial officers in Pittsburgh Municipal Court and Arraignment Court. Since all the requisite support staff is provided in Pittsburgh Municipal Court and Arraignment Court, the workload computation will provide a pure measure of bench time and allow for a fluid and flexible assessment of workload that will properly and consistently equalize assignments for both City of Pittsburgh magisterial district judges, which will number twelve (12) with the proposed realignment, and the thirty-four (34) other district courts in the Fifth Judicial District. Further, the President Judge will review all outstanding orders that contain special designations of magisterial district judges for certain types of filings to determine if they should be modified to more fairly distribute the additional workload.

V. ADDITIONAL REMARKS CONCERNING PROPOSAL:

The President Judge of the Fifth Judicial District is mindful of both state and county budget shortfalls and has implemented a number of cost saving measures, including hiring freezes, to prevent more drastic and debilitating measures that could severely impact the vitality and sustainability of the court system in Allegheny County. Further, the President Judge has spearheaded the intensive and comprehensive development of a court-wide strategic plan to be completed in the Spring of 2012. Chief among the Strategic Planning Committee's goals are the fiscal responsibility and accountability of the court to its funding authorities and the public, by effectively and efficiently expending court resources. However, the President Judge is extremely cognizant of the importance of the magisterial district courts of the Fifth Judicial District and believes that the elimination of any district courts, at this point in time, will significantly reduce access to justice when the public needs for access are increasing.

The input from all forty-six (46) magisterial district judges of the Fifth Judicial District was solicited prior to the completion of this proposal and their comments, if any, appear in their individual district court worksheets.

Exhibit J – Is comprised of the *midpoint average total workload* for all categories of filings for all 48 district courts (including the two (2) district courts closed, effective January 2, 2012) and Pittsburgh Municipal Court (05-0-03). District Court 05-0-03 distorts the average. Exhibit J represents the midpoint average total caseload as between Exhibit B and Exhibit D. 

Pursuant to the authority set forth by Article V, Section 10(c) of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and the general supervisory and administrative authority of the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania as set forth by 42 Pa.C.S. Section 1701, et seq., (Judicial Code), it is directed that an administrative judicial unit hereinafter referred to as the Pittsburgh Municipal Court is established within the Fifth Judicial District, to which all matters within the jurisdiction of the Pittsburgh Magistrates Court are assigned, except those matters within the jurisdiction of Pittsburgh Housing Court pending further Order of this Court. Pursuant to 42 Pa.C.S. Section 325, (Judicial Code), the President Judge of the Fifth Judicial District shall assign, on a rotating basis, Allegheny County District Justices to hear all matters before the Pittsburgh Municipal Court and Pittsburgh Housing Court. The President Judge of the Fifth Judicial District shall exercise full administrative authority over the Pittsburgh Municipal Court and Pittsburgh Housing Court. The responsibilities and

duties of the district justices assigned to Pittsburgh Municipal Court and Pittsburgh Housing Court shall be the same as those of the minor judiciary and district justices as provided by law. All fines, fees, costs, restitution, and other reparations collected by the Pittsburgh Municipal Court shall be distributed in accordance with 42 Pa.C.S. Sections 3571, 3572, 3573, and all other relevant legal authority.

The provisions of this Order shall be effective January 1, 2005.

RULE 117.1 COVERAGE FOR ISSUING WARRANTS, PRELIMINARY ARRAIGNMENTS AND SUMMARY TRIALS, AND SETTING AND ACCEPTING BAIL

(a) All magisterial district judges' offices shall be open for regular business on Mondays through Fridays from 8:30 a.m. until 4:30 p.m. prevailing time except court holidays or as otherwise published on the website of the Fifth Judicial District of Pennsylvania at www.alleghenycourts.us.

(b) Continuous coverage for issuance of search and arrest warrants, acceptance of criminal complaints, conduct of preliminary arraignments, setting and acceptance of bail, holding of summary trials or setting of collateral therefore shall be provided at Pittsburgh Municipal Court Arraignment Court, Municipal Courts Building, 660 First Avenue, Pittsburgh, PA 15219. Arraignment Court shall be staffed by an on-duty issuing authority and support personnel during all off-hours and during regular business hours, if circumstances prevent utilization of the established magisterial district judge office.

(c) Magisterial district judges and the Clerk of Courts shall be authorized to accept bail in accordance with the provisions of the Pa.R.Crim.P. and as between both entities shall provide continuous coverage to do so.

COMMENT: Arraignment Court provides off-hours coverage for Protection from Abuse Act cases pursuant to 23 Pa.C.S. §6110 and Rule 1203 the Pennsylvania Rules of Conduct, Office Standards and Civil Procedure for Magisterial District Judges, and issuance of arrest warrants pursuant to Rules 210 and 211 of Pennsylvania Rules of Juvenile Court Procedure (Pa.R.J.C.P.), as well.

EXHIBIT Q

RULE 131.2 DESIGNATION OF PITTSBURGH MUNICIPAL COURT; ACT 33 CASES

(a) This rule is applicable only to cases involving any child, as that term is defined in Subsection (1) of the definition of "Child" in 42 Pa.C.S. §6302, who is excluded from the Juvenile Act in accordance with Subsection (2)(ii) and (iii) of the definition of "Delinquent act" in 42 Pa.C.S. §6302 (hereinafter "excluded actor").

(b) Pittsburgh Municipal Court is designated as the central site for all filings of criminal complaints, all preliminary arraignments, whether live or by use of advanced communication technology, and for all preliminary hearings for excluded actors.

(c) Magisterial district judges and senior magisterial district judges assigned to Pittsburgh Municipal Court are authorized to conduct preliminary arraignments and preliminary hearings wherein an excluded actor is charged with:

(1) Any of the following prohibited conduct where the child was 15 years of age or older at the time of the alleged conduct and a deadly weapon as defined in 18 Pa.C.S. §2301 (relating to definitions) was used during the commission of the offense, which, if committed by an adult, would be classified as:

- (A) Rape as defined in 18 Pa.C.S. §3121.
- (B) Involuntary deviate sexual intercourse as defined in 18 Pa.C.S. §3123.
- (C) Aggravated assault as defined in 18 Pa.C.S. §2702(a)(1) or (2).
- (D) Robbery as defined in 18 Pa.C.S. §3701(a)(1)(i), (ii) or (iii).
- (E) Robbery of motor vehicle as defined in 18 Pa.C.S. §3702.
- (F) Aggravated indecent assault as defined in 18 Pa.C.S. §3125.
- (G) Kidnapping as defined in 18 Pa.C.S. §2901.
- (H) Voluntary manslaughter as defined in 18 Pa.C.S. §2503.
- (I) An attempt, conspiracy or solicitation to commit murder or any of these crimes, as provided in 18 Pa.C.S. §§901, 902 and 903.

(2) Any of the following prohibited conduct where the child was 15 years of age or older at the time of the alleged conduct and has been previously adjudicated delinquent of any of the following prohibited conduct which, if committed by an adult, would be classified as:

- (A) Rape as defined in 18 Pa.C.S. §3121.
- (B) Involuntary deviate sexual intercourse as defined in 18 Pa.C.S. §3123.
- (C) Robbery as defined in 18 Pa.C.S. §3701(a)(1)(i), (ii) or (iii).
- (D) Robbery of motor vehicle as defined in 18 Pa.C.S. §3702.
- (E) Aggravated indecent assault as defined in 18 Pa.C.S. §3125.
- (F) Kidnapping as defined in 18 Pa.C.S. §2901.
- (G) Voluntary manslaughter as defined in 18 Pa.C.S. §2503.
- (H) An attempt, conspiracy or solicitation to commit murder or any of these crimes as provided in 18 Pa.C.S. §§901, 902 and 903.

(d) The complaint and/or affidavit of probable cause, if applicable, shall include the basis for the arresting officer's determination that an offense is excluded from the Juvenile Act in accordance with Subsection (2)(ii) and/or (iii) of the definition of "Delinquent act" in 42 Pa.C.S. §6302.

(e) Excluded actors shall be afforded preliminary arraignments pursuant to Pa.R.Crim.P. 540.

(f) The magisterial district judge may determine at the preliminary arraignment or at the preliminary hearing that the child is not an excluded actor. In such a case, the affiant may elect to proceed with a delinquency case based upon the same conduct of the child by contacting the Allegheny County Juvenile Probation Office Intake Division or, if the delinquency case implicates issuance of an arrest warrant, the affiant may submit a written allegation to the magisterial district judge, pursuant to Pa.R.J.C.P. 231, and request an arrest warrant, pursuant to Pa.R.J.C.P. 210. The arresting officer shall then comply with the dictates of Pa.R.J.C.P. 220.

(a) Pittsburgh Municipal Court is designated as the central location for all preliminary arraignments, whether live or by use of advanced communication technology, wherein the defendant is charged with Criminal Homicide (18 Pa.C.S. §2501), Murder (18 Pa.C.S. §2502), Voluntary Manslaughter (18 Pa.C.S. §2503), Involuntary Manslaughter (18 Pa.C.S. §2504), Drug Delivery Resulting in Death (18 Pa.C.S. §2506), Homicide by Vehicle (75 Pa.C.S. §3732), Homicide by Vehicle While Driving Under Influence (75 Pa.C.S. §3735), Homicide by Watercraft (30 Pa.C.S. §5502.2), Homicide by Watercraft While Operating Under Influence (30 Pa.C.S. §5502.1), Criminal Homicide of Unborn Child (18 Pa.C.S. §2603), Murder of Unborn Child (18 Pa.C.S. §2604) and/or Voluntary Manslaughter of Unborn Child (18 Pa.C.S. §2605) for a criminal incident arising within the jurisdiction of Allegheny County, Pennsylvania, and for all preliminary hearings for criminal complaints wherein the defendant is charged with Criminal Homicide (18 Pa.C.S. §2501), Murder (18 Pa.C.S. §2502), Voluntary Manslaughter (18 Pa.C.S. §2503), Involuntary Manslaughter (18 Pa.C.S. §2504), Drug Delivery Resulting in Death (18 Pa.C.S. §2506), Homicide by Vehicle (75 Pa.C.S. § 3732), Homicide by Vehicle While Driving Under Influence (75 Pa.C.S. §3735), Homicide by Watercraft (30 Pa.C.S. §5502.2), Homicide by Watercraft While Operating Under Influence (30 Pa.C.S. §5502.1), Criminal Homicide of Unborn Child (18 Pa.C.S. §2603), Murder of Unborn Child (18 Pa.C.S. §2604) and/or Voluntary Manslaughter of Unborn Child (18 Pa.C.S. §2605) for a criminal incident arising within the jurisdiction of Allegheny County, Pennsylvania.

(b) The President Judge shall assign a magisterial district judge to preside in Pittsburgh Municipal Court for any preliminary hearing wherein one or more of the aforementioned charges are brought.

(c) The Allegheny County Court Reporters Office is designated as the official court reporting entity for and shall record and transcribe all notes of testimony at all preliminary hearings in cases heard at Pittsburgh Municipal Court pursuant to this rule.

Notwithstanding the recent nature of the realignment of this court, it should be noted that adding Oakmont Borough workload statistics for Criminal, Non-Traffic, Private Complaint and Traffic filings alone, bring this court's midpoint workload average up to 43,189. Therefore, it is projected that this court's filings will fall into the appropriate and comparable average for the Fifth Judicial District. It is also significant, that at 29 square miles, Plum Borough is the largest Borough in Allegheny County and the second largest in the Commonwealth and encompasses five miles of the Pennsylvania Turnpike. This absorption of Oakmont Borough has placed an undue travel burden upon the Oakmont Police Department. Though unsuccessful thus far, it is anticipated that this court will be moved in 2012 to a location closer to Oakmont Borough than the current location.

For the foregoing reasons, this court is deemed unsuitable for elimination or additional realignment.

designated repository of all traffic and non-traffic cases that were pending or closed from closed court 05-2-46 for disposition and maintenance. By Order of the President Judge, this court is the now the proper venue for all summary traffic citations initiated by the Allegheny County Police assigned to District #3. Moreover, the implementation of the new MDJS in December of 2011 places, albeit transitorily, a concomitant strain on this newly configured court.

Additional staff has been temporarily assigned to this court to address the current responsibilities emanating from the realignment until such time as a statistical evaluation reflects a need for continued assignment or reassignment to another court.

Notwithstanding the recent nature of the realignment of this court, it should be noted that the combined populations of Richland Township and Hampton Township are ten (10) times the combined populations of Frazer Township and East Deer Township. Richland Township has realized a 20.2% increase in population from the 2000 census to the 2010 census.

Both increased caseload and workload numbers from these realignment substitutions are projected to bring this court within appropriate and comparable average ranges for the judicial district. For the foregoing reasons, this court is deemed unsuitable for elimination or additional realignment.

It is apparent that other counties, as a result of active Marcellus Shale drilling, have experienced an increase in all categories of filings at their magisterial district courts. As little drilling has yet to be realized in Allegheny County, it is difficult to forecast the effect. However, from August 2009 to August of 2011, 190 and 130 oil/gas lease transactions have been reported for Findlay Township and North Fayette Township, respectively.

Magisterial District Judge Saveikis wishes it to be noted that the presence of an international airport in his venue is challenging as a large contingent of the Allegheny County Police, including a bomb squad, are headquartered in this district and the yearly presence of 9 million travelers and 144 million pounds of cargo passing through the airport bring a large number of filings ranging from narcotics interdiction search warrant applications to parking violations. In addition, this court's district includes Pittsburgh Technical Institute, Parkway West Vocational Technical School and the Community College of Allegheny County. Lastly, this district is home to a close to 1 million square foot mall that contains most "Big Box" retailers.

The purpose of this response is to indicate the support of the Special Court Judges Association for the plan for re-establishment presented by the Honorable Donna Jo McDaniel, the President Judge of Allegheny County. The Special Court judges Association of Allegheny County feels very strongly that there should be no further reduction in the number of magisterial district courts in the county. Therefore, we embrace the plan that has been presented.

At the end of 2011, two magisterial district courts were closed due to the retirement of the judges. In 2002, the number of magisterial district courts was reduced by seven. That is a total reduction of 9 magisterial district courts in ten years. In addition, in 2005, Pittsburgh Magistrates Court was abolished and its duties were assigned to a newly created Pittsburgh Municipal Court in the Fifth Judicial District. Magisterial District judges were assigned to perform the duties required in this court. There was a loss of 6 additional judges from the Magistrates Court. Thus, there has been a total loss of 15 judicial positions since 2002.

Pittsburgh Municipal Court is a multi-faceted court. This court, primarily staffed by the magisterial district judges from the City of Pittsburgh,

conducts preliminary hearings for criminal cases and summary trials in traffic and non-traffic cases for cases filed by the Pittsburgh police. In addition, this court serves as the 24 hour Arraignment Court for Allegheny County. All of the magisterial judges in Allegheny County serve in this court. Arraignment, acceptance of criminal complaints and the issuance of search and arrest warrants for all of the police departments in Allegheny County are performed. The PMC also serves as the cite for all preliminary hearings for homicide cases filed in Allegheny County and these are assigned to all of the magisterial district judges in the county on a rotating basis. The PMC serves as the central location for all Act 33 preliminary hearings and these are for the juveniles charged as adults. All of the judges in Allegheny County participate in the responsibilities, duties and functions of Pittsburgh Municipal Court. Because of the number of cases filed in Pittsburgh Municipal Court it is hard to fit this court into a statistical comparison of the courts in the City and in the remainder of the County. This adds to the uniqueness of Allegheny County.

AOPC in a recent news release mentioned the general decrease in case filings in magisterial district courts. This was true in Allegheny County, but the 2011 statistics show a 3% increase in Allegheny County from 2010. Disbursements in Allegheny County district courts also increased by \$523,000.00 to almost 25 million dollars.

Allegheny County has a high proportion of the more heavily weighted cases. 16% of the criminal cases and 15% of the private criminal complaints are filed in Allegheny County. 17% of the landlord-tenant cases are filed in Allegheny County and 52% of the emergency petitions for protection from abuse are filed here. This is based on the 2009 statistics and includes cases statewide filed in the MDJS.

The statewide ratio of magisterial district judges to common pleas court judges is 1.56 to 1 (This excludes Philadelphia Common Pleas Court). In Allegheny County, there are now, in 2011, 46 magisterial district judges and then allotted complement of common pleas court judges is 43.

Therefore, for these reasons and those stated in the plan, the Special Court Judges of Allegheny County supports and endorses the plan as proposed by the Honorable Donna Jo McDaniel, President Judge of the Fifth Judicial District.
