- MDJ Borek (38-1-28): Modify proposal to eliminate the extension of the current lease for this district by fourteen months; and transfer jurisdiction of Hatfield Township and Lansdale Borough prior to/on the current lease expiration date for this district.
- Chief of Police-Souderton: Opposed to elimination of district court location in Souderton.
- MDJ Deatelhauser: Opposed to elimination of district court location in Souderton because: there is no public transportation in this area that will take residents to proposed Skippack court; cost to affected municipalities; and safety.
- Chief of Police – Montgomery Township: Proposes realignment of 38-1-18 include all parts of Montgomery Township and all of Hatfield Township and Borough; and 38-1-28 be reestablished.
- Bricks, Landis, Hunsberger & Gringrich LLP: Expresses concern about eliminating 38-1-17.
- Romy Tressler, Home & School Visitor for Souderton Area School District: Expresses concern about the hardship placed on “at risk” families if 38-1-17 is eliminated.
- Police Chief – Lower Frederick Township: Opposed to realignment of 38-2-03 which would move Lower Frederick Township to 38-2-02.
- Chief of Police – Mark Toomey: Opposed to closing 38-1-17 to create a new district for a portion of Norristown.
- MDJ Duffy (38-1-18): Proposes her district cover all of Hatfield Township (rather than one of the two parts) and Hatfield Borough.
- Telford Borough Council – Borough Manager Fournier and Chief of Police Floyd: Opposed to elimination of 38-1-17 without input.

- Edward Levine, Esq. on behalf of Lansdale Borough: Under proposed plan, Lansdale Borough’s voters will not be able to vote for a judge of their choosing until 2015; disparity in caseload for newly formed 38-1-18; and Judge Duffy will be burdened with one of the heaviest caseloads in the county.



Thank you for the opportunity to review and comment on the above referenced proposal. I believe the efficient administration of justice would be better served by modification of the proposal as it relates to Magisterial Districts 38-1-18; 38-1-24 and 38-1-28 to eliminate the proposed extension of the Magisterial District 38-1-28 lease for fourteen months. Alternatively, an immediate search should be made for new leasehold within Towamencin Township to coincide with the present expiration of term on October 31, 2013. This change would eliminate any uncertainty involving the Borough's possible alternative plan for the use of the present leasehold facility upon the expiration of term and promote a smooth transition of office operations as early as possible.

I also believe there is no reason to delay transfer of jurisdiction of Hatfield Township and Lansdale Borough beyond the expiration date of the current lease for Magisterial District 38-1-28 and that timing the proposed transfer will accelerate the desired caseload parity.




Please allow this letter to express both my professional and my personal concerns as to the potential elimination of the Magisterial Court in Souderton. Should this magisterial office be eliminated – and I recommend that it not – several positive community, court, police, and problem-resolution dynamics will be compromised. Our police officers, especially those from Souderton, Telford, and Franconia will travel an additional nine miles to the new court. The new court will realize a significant increase in case load and a severe increase in the needs related to prisoner maintenance.

Our Souderton Court is reasonably proximate to reliable public transportation and many of our court's clients are public transit dependent. Relocating the court to an area less accessible to public transportation burdens many of our victims and witnesses; and will no doubt add to the "failure-to-appear" volume affecting those accused.

Finally, our local Souderton court, and our sitting and local and resident magistrate, enjoys a well founded reputation as a problem solver. Our community needs a judge who can adjudicate local cases for local citizens with the knowledge, compassion, and respect that only a local judge can acquire.

In closing Your Honor, please reconsider the decisions to close our court.

Dear Mike,

In light of the elimination and reestablishment of Souderton District Court, I wish to express concerns from a personal and District Justice perspective.

If anything, equal and convenient access to the courts is the spirit of the system. Many who come to the Souderton court do so on public transportation. Many walk with children in tow and some arrive on bicycles.

Side note: On occasion, I have taken people to their homes because of weather or obvious health issues.

In light of the above, I cannot express enough that, THERE IS NO PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION to relieve the 8.7 miles from the Souderton-Telford area to the Skippack Court. This in itself will increase the failures to appear by witnesses and victims, therefore allowing perpetrators to be without accountability. It will increase the bench warrants for defendants that fail to appear, thus increasing the work load on the courts.

Side Note: A District Judge cannot make a difference in a person's life if they aren't in court. Nor, can a judge protect them from bad faith creditors and unscrupulous landlords.

Another topic is the cost to the municipalities of Souderton, Telford and Franconia Township. The Souderton Court schedules in concert with police officers' work schedules. If this changes, the municipalities will incur overtime plus travel cost to and from the Skippack Court. Also, note these expenses do not benefit the residents of this area because the officer and his vehicle are 8.7 miles and/or 15 minutes out of his jurisdiction.

My final point will be the safety factor. Most people don't realize that the first responder to any emergency is the police officer. This is more prevalent in communities with volunteer fire and medical response teams like we have in this area. It will be a sad day when we have a tragic result because the officer was unable to respond.

The only thing requested here is that the people of the Indian Valley Area get more consideration than, "The judge is retiring, let's close the court". There is a true need for this court and the only suggestions I can make is to give the entirety of Hatfield Township to the Souderton Court. This in addition to the rest of its jurisdiction will bring the case load inline

With the need in Norristown, I will only suggest you move West Norriton Township up to Judge Rebar, which is only 6 miles and public transportation is available. With this, Judge Casillo can help with the Norristown case load.

Please be assured this is not about me. This is about the residents of the Indian Valley. We are blessed with many senior adults, great young people and people that have lost their way in life. Regardless, when they come to the court, and it is not always about court business, they know they will be treated with respect and dignity by the staff. I am not down playing any other office or staff, I just know what we have here.

In closing, I must quote Chief Justice Castille and American Bar Association President William T. Robinson, III from, "AOPConnected" Feb. 2012:

"The road to justice runs through America's courts," Castille said.

"A fully-functioning court system is essential to providing justice for

Pennsylvanias, and to do that, the courts must be provided with the resources which are reasonable and necessary to carry out the mandated functions."

"Together we can restore funding to our courts and renew the promise of equal justice under law that can only exist if courts are open and accessible," Robinson said. "The cost of inaction is too great. We cannot afford to be silent because: no courts, no justice, no freedom."




We are writing in response to the Draft Proposal for the realignment of district courts within the 38th Judicial District. Our office is located in Souderton, Montgomery County, and we have had the pleasure of working extensively with Judge Kenneth E. Deatelhauser as District Judge for Court 38-1-17. We are writing to express our concern about the elimination of this district court upon Judge Deatelhauser's retirement.

While the goal of seeking to utilize resources efficiently is laudable in theory, we strongly believe that any reorganization of courts should take into consideration factors other than simple caseload numbers. Factors such as whether a district court is located near public transportation, whether such a court is physically close to police, township and other resources, and whether the court is in a significant population center are also, in our view, equally important. Taking those factors into account, Souderton is an important location based on its proximity to convenient public transportation with the SEPTA bus lines, its central location to multiple boroughs and police departments for Souderton and Telford Boroughs, and its central location to a significant population of those who have access to the courts resources by foot and other means through sidewalks, crosswalks, and a pedestrian friendly location. Removing Souderton's caseload, as proposed, to Judge Augustine's current location will, we believe, have a negative impact on the provision of judicial services in our area, as a result of the distance and lack of public transportation or walkable access to that court from those residing in the Souderton and Telford municipal areas.

We would urge that you consider a modification to the reorganization plan which takes into serious consideration the negative impacts that removing a court from the population center

the size of Souderton will have, and we request that you reconsider the elimination of District Court 38-1-17. It is our strong belief that continuing to maintain a District Court in our municipality is in the best interests of the Courts and the provision of justice in this area.







Good day Mr. Kehs,

This is Romy Tressler, Home and School Visitor for the Souderton Area School District. You and I worked together long ago, on various occasions, when I was a Juvenile Probation Officer for Montgomery County. It has come to my attention that there is a proposal regarding the "re-establishment" of the District Courts in my local area. (Please know that the views I am expressing are **my own**, as a professional, working with "at risk" families in the Souderton Area School District.) As the Home and School Visitor, I rely heavily on the Souderton District Court (located on Chestnut St. in the Souderton Borough), with regard to truancy issues. Of great concern to me is the hardship which may be placed upon many Souderton Area School District families, who may have greater difficulty getting to the Skippack area to attend Truancy hearings. There are those who do not have easy access to transportation, either their own or public. (In fact, I don't know that public transportation to the Skippack area from Telford, Franconia or Souderton even exists.) The location of the Souderton Area Magisterial Court allows easier access for those families who find themselves economically challenged; also, to those with strict time constraints due to their jobs and those with other children to consider. It is a more convenient and central place for many families and their children, especially when considering the close proximity to two of our three secondary buildings, from where the majority of truancy referrals come. Though I have not done any specific statistical analysis, I think it is safe to say that few Truancy hearings are missed, at least in part, due to the location of Souderton's Magisterial Court.

I am also concerned, in no small way, for local law enforcement whose time will be impacted.

I truly hope that before any "realignment" occurs, that the potential impact on families residing in the Souderton, Telford, and Franconia areas will be considered.


My name is Paul E. Maxey and I am the Chief of Police of the Lower Frederick Township Police Department. Currently, my municipality is part of Magisterial Judicial District 38-2-03. I have had a chance to review the proposed district reestablishment and have discovered that Lower Frederick Township would be subject to reassignment with Judge Catherine Hummel Fried, becoming part of District 38-2-02. With this information in hand, I have had a chance to talk with members of my agency, elected officials and the community.

At this time, I wish to register my vigorous opposition to this intended proposal, as I have both personal and professional concerns surround the implications of this decision. As the chief administrator of the police department it is my responsibility to assure the effectiveness and over-all performance of the men that I command. I see intrinsic logistical problems with the proposed court's current location and feel that ease of access is paramount to streamlining effectiveness for my officers. Holding a position of trust in my community, I believe that it is important that I represent the interests of the residents that I serve. The citizens of Lower Frederick Township, through the democratic process of elections, have chosen to place their faith and trust with District Justice Maurice H. Saylor. I feel that a forced change to District Justice Hummel Fried would circumvent the electoral process and require the residents of Lower Frederick Township to accept a judicial body that they neither elected nor are familiar with.

The Lower Frederick Township Police Department is a small agency which generates a light work-load for the District Court. After speaking with District Justice Saylor, I have been assured that by allowing Lower Frederick Township to remain part of Judicial District 38-2-03, we would in no way interfere with other proposed changes to that particular court.

Dear Mr. Kehs,

As Chief of Police for Hatfield Township and Hatfield Borough, I have reviewed the proposed reestablished Magisterial Districts plan for Montgomery County. I have also discussed this matter with members of the Hatfield Township Board of Commissioners and the Township Manager. While I appreciate the intent of the plan to redistrict resources so that Norristown's magisterial districts have a better proportioned work load, I disagree with the plan to get to that end.

First and foremost, I believe the closing of District Court 38-1-17 is a mistake. The municipalities of Hatfield, Franconia, Telford and Souderton continue to grow in population and police incidents. This district court is conducive to individuals who walk to district court and who are restricted financially to have self-transportation. This district court is familiar with the needs of the residents of the Indian Valley and Hatfield Valley areas. While I understand the timing of this court closing due to the current sitting judge's age, the need does not diminish to maintain this court.

Should the District Court Administrator still be intent upon the closure of 38-1-17, I would suggest that a more practical re-alignment occur involving courts 38-1-28 and 38-1-18.


Having discussed this matter with Judge Duffy, I have learned that she is more than willing to take on all of Hatfield Township and Hatfield Borough along with Montgomery Township. This makes more practical sense than the moving of Lansdale Borough matters to her court and placing the Hatfield work in Judge Borek's district (38-1-28). His court would have to re-locate to an office in either Towamencin Township or Hatfield. Court familiarity with Hatfield concerns and knowledge of officers would have to be re-established. These

levels of understanding all-ready exist with Judge Duffy's office as a portion of Hatfield Township already comes under her venue. The problems associated with Lansdale Borough have no level of understanding currently with Judge Duffy's court and similar to the issue in Souderton's court, the residents in boroughs who to have dealings with district court, depend on the close proximity and easy access to these offices.

In conclusion, perhaps the county/state should consider funding an additional magisterial district to meet the growing needs elsewhere and if not, consider the re-alignment as put forth in this letter.

I have thoroughly reviewed the draft proposal for the realignment of Magisterial Districts with both Chief Brady of Montgomery Township Police Department and Chief Toomey of Hatfield Township Police Department (also serving Hatfield Borough) and offer the following response.

In order to effectively serve our constituents in this area, I recommend that my my judicial district encompass all of Hatfield Township (I now, as you know, cover one of 2 parts of the township) and Hatfield Borough. Although my case load will be alightly higher with this scenario than it would be with covering Montgomery Township and Lansdale Borough as proposed, the impracticalities that would follow with the addition of Lansdale Borough would be overwhelming for both my staff, and more importantly, for Lansdale residents.

Most essentially, access to one's local justice system is a paramount right for our citizens. Currently Judge Borek's Lansdale court is located on Main Street, within walking distance to many of its users/residents and is also easily accessed utilizing public transportation. Due to Lansdale's socio-economic status, this is a critical concern and moving the local court for these residents to my location will deprive them of their ability to seek justice, defend themselves and/or easily make payments on their fines/costs. Increasing numbers of warrants will be issued for failures to appear for court, constable fees will increase, my staff will be frustrated with constant calls regarding no transportation options and fines and costs will go uncollected. Resolution of cases will be significantly thwarted and my court will never see the foot traffic that the Lansdale court currently sees. There will be further confusion for parties and witnesses with the scheduling and re-scheduling of cases to my location and the overall transition from Judge Borek's court, with different practices than my court, will be difficult.

Simplicity and logic suggest that I continue covering Hatfield Township (and cover all of the Township, including the Borough) as we are currently working effectively together and my staff has become very familiar and comfortable with the practices of and communication with that Department. There will be only minor adjustments with my proposal and the similar communities of Hatfield and Montgomery Township (with their likewise similar legal issues) will continue to provide smooth consistency in the types of cases before me. The "309 corridor" that Hatfield and Montgomery Townships share is also significant in terms of the businesses, police issues, etc. that these two departments encounter on a daily basis. My staff and I are pleased to take on this proposal and Chiefs Toomey and Brady are wholeheartedly endorsing this resolution as well, as evidenced by their respective letters to you. Please seriously consider this practical option and feel free to contact me with any questions or concerns you may have. Thank you very much.

On behalf of the Telford Borough Council we would like to express our concern regarding the proposed changes to the magisterial judicial district 38-1-17 that is currently presided over by Judge Kenneth E. Deatelhauser. It is our understanding that upon Judge Deatelhauser's retirement in 2014, the proposed plan is to eliminate the district entirely and to have Telford Borough absorbed into the Skippack magisterial district.

First of all, a change of this magnitude should not be made without adequate input from the stakeholders that would be most affected. Secondly, the plan is flawed because it does not consider the fact that it would have a significant impact on the court's access by residents of Telford, as well as create considerable and costly logistical issues for our police department.

Mr. Kehs:

I write to express my concern regarding the proposed realignment of the County District Courts; specifically, the elimination of District Court 38-1-17 in Souderton.

While it may seem advantageous on paper to eliminate Souderton District Court, and to merge Souderton, Telford and Franconia Township into Judge Augustine's Skippack Court, the fact is that many residents of Souderton and Telford would find the change not only a hardship, but actually an impediment to their access to the Court. Skippack is not situated in close proximity to Souderton Borough. Many residents in the boroughs of Souderton and Telford have transportation issues and there is no public transportation between the Indian Valley and Skippack. Accordingly, the proposed realignment will restrict access to the court for the residents who currently work and reside in the boundaries of 38-1-17.

The draft proposal also does not take into account project growth rates for the area in the near future. The Souderton Area School District recently opened a new \$125 million high school. The District spent much time debating whether to rehabilitate the old high school in Souderton Borough, or to build a new state-of-the-art facility to accommodate the growing population, specifically in Franconia and Lower Salford Townships. The District, recognizing the growing populations of both townships, opted to build the new high school in anticipation of the growth of the school district. This spring Souderton High School will graduate their largest senior class in history. Many of these 17 and 18 year olds will be the individuals accessing the District Court over the next two decades.

Our Court now proposes to eliminate Souderton District Court and to fold its municipalities into 38-1-24. Judge Augustine's Court already includes Lower Salford, which was one of the two townships that led the Souderton Area School District to decide to build the new high school in anticipation of population growth. The Court will also move Franconia Township to Judge Augustine, giving to that District Court the two specific townships that concerned the Souderton Area School District. Over the next 10 to 20 years, as the current students in the school district reach adulthood, the case load at District Court 38-1-24 will naturally increase with the increased adult population. This increase will necessitate yet another realignment which will consider Lower Salford, Franconia and the entire Indian Valley. Eliminating Souderton District Court fails to recognize that which was apparent several years ago to the Souderton Area School District.

Please consider these issues as this matter and the draft proposal is considered.

SUBJECT: PROPOSED CLOSURE OF MAGISTERIAL COURT 38-1-17

On February 3, 2012, the Administrator of the Montgomery County District Court published a draft proposal entitled "*Reestablishment of the Magisterial Districts Within the 38th Judicial District – Montgomery County 2012.*" The proposal outlines the realignment of municipalities to which the District Magistrates are assigned. This realignment is designed to give each office a more even distribution of the workload.

Of particular interest to the municipalities in the Indian Valley is a proposal to completely eliminate District Court 38-1-17 in Souderton as of January 1, 2015 after Judge Kenneth Deatelhauser's retirement. This is the only office that is proposed for closing in the county. The report proposes that Franconia Township, Souderton, and Telford be re-assigned to Judge Albert Augustine's office, number 38-1-24 in Skippack Township. (See pages 9-11)

The closing and re-assignment will negatively impact the three municipalities for the following reasons:

For police officers, the court in Souderton is situated less than three miles from the Franconia Township Police Department Building. The distance from the police department to Judge Augustine's office is nine miles. The trip for Franconia officers to Skippack court to attend hearings and deliver paperwork will require them to travel entirely through Lower Salford Township and back again. In most cases, our officers are assigned to patrol duties and are "on-call" when at court. A quick trip back to Franconia will cause unnecessary delays for the officers responding to an emergency call. It will also cause an inconvenience to neighboring police departments who may be required to respond to and handle the call until the arrival of our officers. Conversely, court in Souderton is less than one mile from the township boundaries.

For residents, the farthest point in Franconia to Souderton District Court is six miles. However, for residents to travel from the farthest point in Franconia to the Skippack office is eleven miles. Souderton court is situated at a convenient location for residents of the three municipalities. This office has a very high number of "walk-up" visits by residents of the boroughs since there are sidewalks on all of the public streets. The SEPTA public transit bus provides direct service to that office. There is no means of public transportation from the Indian Valley to Skippack.

This will provide a notable inconvenience (as well as extra fuel consumption) to Franconia residents who may be filing landlord/tenant actions, small claims complaints, paying fines, or appearing as a witness in a court hearing. The staff at Souderton court has that intangible "local touch" where they know their customers and treat them in a helpful way.

Please be assured that there is no animosity between the police department and Judge Augustine. He is a very capable Magisterial Judge with whom we have an excellent relationship. The reasons for our concern are mostly centered on the convenience factor for the police and the residents of the local communities. Based on those stated concerns, I am asking for the Franconia Township Board of Supervisors to express their opposition to the closing of the Souderton District Court when providing comments to the draft proposal.

Dear Mr. Kehs,

The proposal issued on February 3, 2012 by the Administrator of the Montgomery County District Court published in a report entitled "*Reestablishment of the Magisterial Districts Within the 38th Judicial District – Montgomery County 2012*" was formally reviewed and discussed at the Franconia Township Board of Supervisors (BOS) work session held on March 19, 2012.

After reviewing the information provided in the report and the submission of a report from Joseph S. Kozeniewski, Chief of Police, the BOS have taken the position that the proposal to eliminate Court 38-1-17 in Souderton, is not the best proposal and eliminates a court that has faithfully served the residents of the Indian Valley in Northern Montgomery County with a high level of professionalism and access to the District Justice that would be sorely missed if eliminated.

Besides the inconvenience and time that it would take away from our police department, as defined in the attached report, it also would severely impact access to the District Court system by requiring residents to travel nearly 12 miles without any access to public transportation. Currently many residents that must appear at District Court 38-1-17 are able to reach the current location via walking, bicycling and SEPTA. The BOS see this as a very important component of the Souderton location, not to mention the impact that an emergency response requirement by an on-duty patrol officer would have if he were called out of court. Depending upon assistance from adjoining police departments is not a primary policy for the Franconia Township police department which operates 24/7.

If the Court Administrator believes that the Souderton location should handle additional cases, we would suggest that realignment be considered which could include the whole of Hatfield Township that is currently split between two courts according to the proposal.

As elected and appointed public officials, we believe that providing convenient and accessible public services is key to affording residents the opportunity to engage in public functions and the Souderton location achieves this goal, not to mention the familiarity and connection that so many residents have to the Souderton court and its administrators.

The Franconia Township BOS respectfully submits this response to the proposal as an objection to the closing and relocation of District Court 38-1-17 and recommend that it is re-evaluated and determined to be an integral part of Montgomery County, particularly to the Indian Valley with the majority of its population residing in the current jurisdiction of this District Court.

We appreciate your consideration and are more than willing to meet with the Court Administrator regarding this matter and its proposal.

Please forward the following letter to President Judge Furber for his review:

Honorable Judge Furber,

I am writing on behalf of myself and the citizens of Lansdale Borough in hopes that you reconsider or alter the current Reestablishment of the Magisterial Districts within the 38th Judicial District of Pennsylvania. Currently, Lansdale Borough is within Magisterial District 38-1-28, which also covers Towamencin Township, in which Judge Harold Borek presides. During the 2000 reestablishment, elected Judge David Keightly (DJ 38-1-18) was moved out of Lansdale Borough and Judge Borek became the presiding judge without election. In 2003, with little time to scrutinize the newly re-aligned Judge (re-aligned at the end of 2002), Lansdale elected Judge Borek unopposed. After 6 years, Lansdale citizens voiced their concerns and overwhelmingly voted for Judge Borek's opposition by a 60/40 margin. Relying heavily on his home jurisdiction of Towamencin, Judge Borek managed to escape with a victory by 12 votes total! Despite a larger registered voting total in Towamencin, Lansdale voters came out in force for this election to voice their opposition.

It is clear that the citizens of Lansdale Borough have worked hard to express their concerns at the voting booth. In Pennsylvania it is an essential right for citizens to have the opportunity to elect not only their executive and legislative officials, but also their Magisterial District Judge. Unfortunately, Lansdale Borough (and several other boroughs and townships in Montgomery County) will have their voices stifled. Due to the nature of the re-establishment plan, instead of having the opportunity to vote for their District Judge in 2015, Lansdale Borough will now have to wait until 2017. An eight year lapse in their right to vote. In addition, Lansdale will be subjected to at least 2 years of District Judge Andrea Duffy, whom they did not vote for, and who narrowly won her own primary to become District Judge for 38-1-18.

While it is true that Lansdale Borough is subject to the combined result of their Magisterial District in the election of their judge. It is just as clear that the voters of Lansdale have been subjected to the whims of Supreme Court as much as the election process. Under the reestablishment plans over the last two decades Lansdale has had only one contested election, in which the candidate they favored heavily lost by 12 votes overall. Also, within 10 years they will have had two Judges thrust upon them without any say in the matter whatsoever. The voters in Lansdale clearly have opinions on this matter and expressed them in the last election. The re-alignment plan would show, yet again, that the will of the people in Lansdale is irrelevant.

In addition to the clear disenfranchisement of Lansdale voters, the re-alignment would create an unnecessary disparity in caseload for the newly formed District Court 38-1-18. In 2000, the re-alignment was created due to the very heavy caseload in Lansdale Borough and Montgomery Township. In determining caseloads, the District Justice Administration looks at court caseloads, however it does not take into account the caseload effects of individual Townships and Boroughs on overall caseloads. As a former clerk with District Court 38-1-18, it was evident that Lansdale Borough and Montgomery Township have significant caseloads as compared to neighboring Townships and Boroughs. As you know, caseload is not necessarily determined by population, which is the primary basis for the current reestablishment plan. Socio-economic factors, geographic factors, and traffic

patterns can play a significant role in determining caseload. □ Caseload is not proportional strictly to district population. □ Based on past history and the current conditions, re-aligning District Court 38-1-18 back to its pre-2002 borders will create the caseload disparity that the 2000 re-establishment plan sought to alleviate in the first place. □

□□□ It is important to note that Judge Duffy is only in her first months in office and will now be burdened with one of the heaviest caseloads in the county. □ In 2002, an experienced Judge (Keightly), with a large staff, had difficulties maintaining the court due to the heavy caseload. □ The current re-alignment would cause major stress to a new Judge with a relatively small staff. □ Also, it should be noted that the estimated caseload for Lansdale is 2,800 cases per year. □ As a former employee for the District Court in Lansdale, I can attest that this is a low estimate that clearly is being used to justify an unnecessary re-alignment.

□□ So what are the alternatives?

□□ While I believe the overall re-alignment in Montgomery County has merit and there are some obvious measures that need to be taken, the re-alignments to courts 38-1-18 and 38-1-28 are irrelevant to these problems, would not specifically address the issues of the county court system, and most importantly, would dis-enfranchise thousands of voters. □ It is clear that District Court 38-1-24 has a disparity in caseload. □ Obviously, the dissolution of District Court 38-1-17 would create a significant increase to surrounding courts, however, District Court 38-1-24 could theoretically take over all of District Court 38-1-17 caseload without disrupting any balance in the other courts. □ While District Court 38-1-24's caseload would increase significantly, it would not be an excessive caseload compared to other courts, as the original caseload for 38-1-24 was already 32% less than the average for the county. □ However, if the goal is to keep Hatfield Township and Borough unified under one court, then District Court 38-1-18 is the logical choice to consume this territory. □ The caseload would not be as significant an increase as that of taking over Lansdale Borough. □ Hatfield Township Police already have a relationship with District Court 38-1-18. □ In addition, the voters in Lansdale borough would not be dis-enfranchised for two extra years.

□□□ If solidifying Hatfield is not a key concern, and the Court believes that the caseloads would be significant to District 38-1-18 retaining all of Hatfield, then the alleged decreased load could be offset by dividing Hatfield Township and Borough between courts 38-1-18 and 38-1-28. □ Based on the current geographic requirements this would be completely legal, would satisfy caseload issues, and most important, would not disenfranchise voters in both Lansdale Borough, Hatfield Borough, and Hatfield Township.

□□ If none of these suggestions are taken into consideration, I would suggest reestablishing the election period for District Court 38-1-18 and 38-1-24. □ There is one fact that remains throughout this whole process...voters in many areas will be dis-enfranchised by the Court for at least 2 years. □ The right to elect officials is one of the fundamental principles of our country. □ The election process is serious and should not be minimized by reestablishment plans that essentially remove that right from a large portion of citizens. □ What is the whole point of having people go through all of the stress, aggravation, indignity, expense, and humiliation of running for office if the court, with a stroke of a pen, can determine who serves the people, and for how long? □ I would suggest moving the elections for District Courts 38-1-18 and 38-1-24 from 2017 up to 2015 to eliminate ALL voting issues. □ The Court has already re-aligned Magisterial Districts without any say, we should not also impose an elected official on these voters as well. □□ I would also suggest applying the re-establishment of election dates for all Magisterial Districts in which voters will be dis-enfranchised for 2 years or more.

□□ In the case at hand, Lansdale Borough would not only be appointed a Judge whom they did not elect for the second time in 10 years, they would also have to remain under this un-elected official for at least 2 extra years before having any electoral powers. □ In addition, the caseload for the citizens of Lansdale would now be placed in a court with a more burdened docket, an undermanned staff, and an inexperienced judge to handle this increased workload. □ As mentioned above, none of this is necessary to solve the problems in the county court system. □ District Court 38-1-17 can be dissolved without placing such burdens on the citizens of Lansdale. □

□□ Because an easy and fair solution exists regarding the dissolution of District Court 38-1-17, others have expressed their concerns to me in suggesting□that the□re-establishment plan has some political motives.□ Lansdale Borough voted strongly against their incumbent judge, and would likely create problems for the incumbent in 2015.□ Rather than deal with that possibility, the decision makers at the County have decided to alleviate this problem by redistricting the incumbent away from his vulnerable area, while also extending the election date in this area out to 2017, so as to ensure that this vulnerable area does not "disrupt" things politically for as long as possible.□ When a borough votes 60/40 against an incumbent (rare), and then is re-aligned with their next election pushed out 2 years, it should raise some very obviously concerns to this Court.

□□□ It is for the above reasons that I implore District Justice Administration and the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania to reconsider portions of the proposed reestablishment of the Magisterial Districts within the 38th Judicial District - Montgomery County Pennsylvania.□
