RESPONDENT WOLF'S APPLICATION IN THE NATURE OF A MOTION TO STAY THE DEADLINE FOR FILING A PLEADING RESPONSIVE TO THE AMENDED PETITION FOR REVIEW

Pursuant to Pennsylvania Rule of Appellate Procedure 123, Respondent

Governor Thomas W. Wolf (Governor Wolf), by and through his counsel, files this

application to request that the Court stay the deadline for filing a pleading responsive

to the Amended Petition for Review for the following reasons:

1. Petitioners initiated this matter on September 14, 2017, by filing a Petition for Review claiming that Governor Wolf violated the Pennsylvania Constitution by allowing the General Appropriations Bill to become law without taking corrective action to veto the Bill entirely, or use the item veto to reduce appropriations to comport with actual and estimated revenues. PFR, **PP72-73**.

2. Petitioners also challenged the constitutionality of the authorization and extension of a line of credit from Treasury's Short Term Investment Pool to provide sufficient liquidity within the Commonwealth's General Fund to meet expenditure obligations when projected expenditures temporarily exceed anticipated revenues.

3. Petitioners' arguments are premised on the assertion that the Commonwealth does not have a balanced operating budget. *See* PFR, ¶¶50-83.

Petitioners filed an Amended Petition for Review on November 7,
2017, which did not materially change the allegations raised in the original Petition for Review.¹

5. Pursuant to R.A.P. 1516(b), a pleading responsive to the Amended Petition for Review is due on or before December 7, 2017.

¹ Secretary Albright was named as a Respondent in the original Petition for Review only in paragraphs seeking injunctive relief. *See, e.g.*, PFR at 24, "wherefore" clause. The Amended Petition for Review does not name Secretary Albright; however, it adds the "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania" as a Respondent.

6. On November 14, 2017, a Motion to Dismiss for Mootness was jointly filed by Respondent Treasurer Joseph M. Torsella and Auditor General Eugene DePasquale.

7. On November 28, 2017, Respondents Senators Joseph B. Scarnati, III and Jake Corman joined in Treasurer Torsella's and Auditor General DePasquale's Motion to Dismiss.

8. Governor Wolf joins in the Motion to Dismiss.

9. On November 29, 2017, this Honorable Court issued an order scheduling a hearing for December 12, 2017 at 10:00 a.m., on the Motion to Dismiss.

10. The Court's decision on the Motion to Dismiss may be entirely dispositive of the Amended Petition.

11. To avoid unnecessary pleadings and duplicative arguments, it is in the interest of judicial economy to delay filing a responsive pleading until the Motion to Dismiss has been decided.

WHEREFORE, Respondent Wolf respectfully requests that this Honorable Court stay the deadline for filing a pleading responsive to the Amended Petition for Review until after the Motion to Dismiss is decided.
