**ORDER OF COURT**

AND NOW, April 14, 2020, in accordance with the Order of the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania dated April 1, 2020, and this Court having originally declared a judicial emergency in the 41<sup>st</sup> Judicial District through April 14, 2020, I now DECLARE that the judicial emergency be extended through May 29, 2020. The Administrative Order for Temporary Electronic Filing and Scheduling of Hearings During Public Health Emergency dated March 18, 2020, shall remain in effect through the duration of the judicial emergency.

Further, any case postponed due to this emergency shall be scheduled after May 29, 2020. Any postponement caused by the judicial emergency shall be considered a court postponement and shall constitute excludable time for purposes of the application of Rule 600. *See Commonwealth v. Bradford*, 46 A.3d 693 (Pa. 2012) and *Commonwealth v. Mills*, 162 A.3d 323 (Pa. 2017).
