<p>This MDJ has a high number of landlord tenant cases. This is because of the socioeconomic area he serves; his landlords have higher percentage of non-paying tenants due to their clientele. These landlords and tenants would not be well served by diverting the cases to another MDJ, as he literally knows the buildings and homes they are discussing.</p> <p>This MDJ has had a high number of private summary cases in the past due to the Altoona area school district tax office having been located in his district. However it has now moved to another MDJ district (Jones) and these tax complaint filings will go down in the future.</p> <p>This MDJ has a high number of MD cases due to weddings, he does at least 3 or more per week. This is by choice, and his constituents like this, and like him doing their wedding in particular, and are well served by it. They would not be well served by diverting this business to another MDJ.</p>

The alignment of the Appalachian Mountains creates a distinct north-south travel pattern in Blair County, and the population is concentrated along this axis. MDJ District 24-3-01 covers the northern part of the county, specifically Tyrone Township and Borough, Bellwood Borough and Antis and Snyder Townships. The Tyrone Police Department, the Bellwood Police Department, and the Pennsylvania State Police service these areas. It would be burdensome in terms of travel time and expense to the people in the district and the police departments to have to travel south for M.D.J services. This MDJ District has the greatest number of alternate programs for its citizens, such as veterans diversionary court, truancy court, and an anticipated drug diversion court.</p>

<p>This Judicial District has a high number of civil filings because it includes commercial business areas, specifically two malls; the Logan Valley Mall and the Logan Towne Center. The Logan Valley Mall is a failing mall, and is predicted to lose or go out of business in the next 10 years, thus reducing or eliminating the number of filings currently generated by that business. Additionally, the Logan Towne Center is seeing less traffic and business as people increasingly shop online. There are very new, young officers in the Logan Township Police Department who have in recent years been extremely active in traffic enforcement; we expect this to decrease over the next 10 years. Finally, the recently elected young MDJ perceives no inequity and has no objection to the current and projected volume of cases.</p>

Blair Township, Hollidaysburg Borough, Duncansville Borough and Williamsburg Borough police departments are located in this district, as well as is the Pennsylvania State Police barracks. This MDJ office is located in Hollidaysburg, the county seat, and is located on the street between the courthouse and the jail, which is convenient for the police departments it serves. This MDJ office has all filings from the prison, which have been depressed during Covid, and its criminal and traffic filings have increased in 2022 and are projected to increase. It would be very difficult and burdensome for the constituents of this district if they were combined with another district because of the far-flung nature of the geography and population loci, which would result in unduly difficult travel to court.</p>

Also, this Magisterial District Judge has unquantifiable demands on her time in dealing with five separate police agencies and their schedules and idiosyncrasies. This Magisterial District Judge has also traditionally been involved with the Blair County truancy court and is considering drug diversionary programs. Finally, because of the location of her court between the jail and the courthouse, this MDJ is called upon for extra service not measurable by statistical standards. Therefore her overall service is not inequitable compared to her fellow MDJs. Finally, no MDJ has voiced any complaint of inequity to this Court.</p>

None of these cases were from county-wide drug sweeps or from extraterritorial filings by the Pennsylvania State Police. this magisterial district is located in a largely rural and farming district, and the citizens and police departments in this district,if changed, would have to travel great distances for service because of the peculiarity of Blair county geography, which orients everything on a north-south axis. There are 25 miles from the eastern end of the district to the western end of the district. If these boundaries were extended, it would be burdensome to the constituents. This district is the extreme southern end of the county. It is served by the Freedom Township, Greenfield Township, Martinsburg, Roaring Spring and North Woodbury Township police departments. These are extremely small rural departments. It is also home to Old Order Mennonite community. The character of this district is very different than the more urban districts of Altoona, Tyrone, or Hollidaysburg. This MDJ office is located at the Blair County Arirport which provides increased security. The next closest MDJ office is 25 minute drive. To consolidate those offices would mean a 50 minute drive one way on a difficult country road for some citizens of the district.</p>
