SUMMARY

The Commonwealth Court of Pennsylvania was created by an amendment to the Pennsylvania Constitution in 1968. The court hears appeals from county courts of common pleas and state administrative agencies. From county courts, the Commonwealth Court hears appeals in matters involving zoning, taxation, civil service, negligence cases involving state and local government, and eminent domain, among others. From state administrative agencies, the court hears appeals in matters including workers' and unemployment compensation, environmental issues, welfare claims, and public utility rate disputes. In addition, the court acts as a trial court in certain types of cases where the Commonwealth is a party to the case.

In 2003, there were 4,627 new cases filed. This represents a 3% decrease over the number of new cases filed in 2002.

New cases filed by inmates declined slightly in 2003. The number of new inmate cases in 2003 was 588. This represents a decrease of 5% compared to the number of inmate cases filed in 2002. Nevertheless, inmate cases represent 76% of the total cases filed in the court's original jurisdiction.

In its appellate jurisdiction, workers' compensation and unemployment compensation appeals continued to be filed in large numbers. There were 629 new workers' compensation appeals filed in 2003. There were 577 unemployment compensation appeals filed in 2003, an increase of 27% over 2002. With respect to appeals from courts of common pleas, there was a 4% decrease in the number of new appeals filed.

The court disposed of a total of 4,625 cases in 2003 a decrease of 3% compared to 2002. There were 1,762 opinions filed in 2003. The average elapsed time from assignment of the case to the filing of the opinion was 72 days in 2003 compared to 97 days in 2002. This is significantly better than the American Bar Association's standard for assignment to disposition of 90 days. The court disposed of 5,910 ancillary motions, applications and petitions in 2003.

The court's mediation program continued to be successful in 2003. A total of 171 cases were referred to mediation, 167 were mediated, and 71 cases were settled, thus eliminating the need for further litigation.


Finally, this high level of productivity resulted in the fewest cases in inventory in the modern history of the court. There were 1,299 appeals pending at the end of 2003 compared to 2,790 appeals pending as recently as 1997. By way of further contrast, there were 3,439 pending appeals in 1988.








Commonwealth Court PRISONER LITIGATION


