
How Pennsylvania's Common Pleas Courts Operate



Trial courts of Pennsylvania

- These courts hear major civil and criminal cases as well as cases involving children and their families.
- Hear appeals originating in the magisterial district courts as well as from some state and most local government agencies.

Organized into **60 judicial districts**



Each court is led by a

president judge, who is

responsible for supervising
all of the judges in his/her

county as well as the local
magisterial district judges.

The president judge is
also responsible for

overseeing administrative
tasks.

458 judges

who are elected for

10 year terms

The number of judges in each judicial district varies – ranging from

one to 93 judges.

Average 700,000 cases per year
