

This district is geographically the largest in Indiana County and largely rural in nature. If the district were to be expanded, the citizens of the district would not be provided adequate access to the courts because of the distance they would have to travel to the court. The county jail and a state correctional facility are located within this district. These facilities are frequently the source of serious criminal cases that are presented to the District Court. The magisterial district judge of this district devotes time and effort to travel to the state correctional facility to preside over preliminary hearings held inside the institution.

MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT REESTABLISHMENT

Pursuant to the Pennsylvania Constitution, a reestablishment of magisterial districts is to occur every ten years in the year following the federal census. Each magisterial district within Indiana County has been analyzed and evaluated with respect to population, caseload, and workload measures. As a result of this analysis, a proposal is planned to be submitted to the Pennsylvania Supreme Court recommending that all of the magisterial districts shall be reestablished as they currently exist in Indiana County. Of all of the sixth-class counties in Pennsylvania, Indiana County's Magisterial District Judges have the fourth highest caseload average.
