

MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT RE-ESTABLISHMENT 2022

PROPOSAL SUMMARY

The following proposal will be submitted to the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts (AOPC) and the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania after a 30 day publication and comment period, which begins on January 25, 2022 and runs through February 25, 2022.

The Judicial District Summary worksheet and the Magisterial District Summary worksheets were supplied by AOPC as part of a package to be used by all of the Commonwealth's judicial districts that operate Magisterial District Courts. The data used to formulate comparisons within Judicial District 36 and with other Fourth Class Counties was supplied by the AOPC for a six year period of time: 2014 – 2019. There was deliberate elimination of 2020 data which was skewed due to the pandemic.

There were major changes that took place during the last re-establishment process in 2012. The District Court in Aliquippa (36-1-03) was eliminated and became part of 36-3-04 on January 1, 2016; on January 1, 2013, two Magisterial Districts were realigned by the movement of Rochester Township from 36-2-01 to 36-3-01; and on June 1, 2012, via Administrative Order, Pa. State Police began filing all citations and criminal complaints on the Pa. Turnpike in Beaver County in District Court 36-3-02, even if the offense occurred on the portion of the turnpike in 36-2-01 or 36-3-01. The proposal for 2022 contains no changes. The changes which were part of the 2012 Re-establishment process are to remain in place, including the Administrative Order governing the filing of citations and criminal complaints on the Pa. Turnpike.

This proposal will be published for 30 days, during which time the public may submit comments. The deadline for comments to be received is the close of business, at 4:30 p.m. on Friday, February 25, 2022.
