SUPPLEMENTAL CLARIFICATION ORDER

AND NOW, this 30th day of October, 2024, upon consideration of the Petition for an Emergency Special and Preliminary Injunction and of Plaintiffs' Verified Complaint and Supporting Memorandum of Law, and after hearing held October 30, 2024 before the undersigned, the Court hereby ORDERS and DECREES as follows:

- a) Defendants' actions in turning away voters who sought to apply for a mail-in ballot and receive one in person before the deadline of 5:00 p.m. on October 29, 2024 violated the Election Code.
- b) Defendants shall permit any persons who wish to apply for, receive, vote and return a mail-in ballot ("On-Demand Voting") to appear at the Board of Elections Doylestown Office at 55 E. Court Street, Doylestown, Pennsylvania 18901. The Bucks County Board of Elections shall make On-Demand Voting available to all qualified voters appearing at the Board of Elections Doylestown Office between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. on October 31, 2024 and November 1, 2024 and at all Satellite Offices between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. on October 31, 2024 and November 1, 2024. Any such voter who is in line to vote "On-Demand" by the

closing time of the office at which the voter appears shall be permitted to vote. This directive is in accordance with both 25 P.S. §3060(e), which permits election day ballots to be cast by any qualified voter in line at the polling place prior to the close of the polls, and the public guidance of the Secretary of the Commonwealth as cited by Plaintiffs' Complaint.
