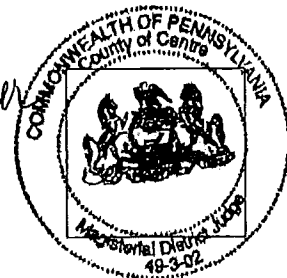

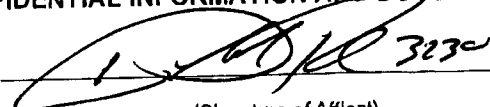

2. During his career, your affiant has received additional law enforcement and drug law training through Departmental in-service, and other law enforcement sessions. Your affiant is currently assigned to the State College Police Criminal Investigations Section with a concentration in drug investigations and has held that position since October 2007.

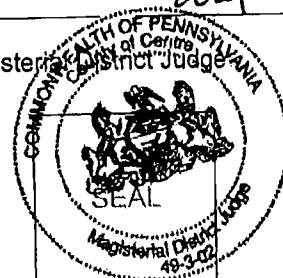

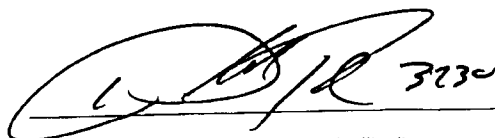

Your affiant conducted a search of the RMS/Names database for the "Tom Robinson" and located THOMAS MICHAEL ROBINSON with a date of birth of 12/02/2002 and a home address of 21 Holland Road, Pittsburgh, PA 15235. Your affiant also found that on 07/14/24, THOMAS ROBINSON was stopped for a traffic violation and was driving a black Jeep Cherokee bearing Pennsylvania vehicle registration number: MDB5069. A registration check revealed this vehicle was registered to PAUL ROBINSON of 21 Holland Road, Pittsburgh, PA 15235. At the time of the traffic stop, THOMAS ROBINSON had a loaded 9mm handgun in the glove box of the Jeep. THOMAS ROBINSON also possessed a valid Pennsylvania gun permit. Your affiant then conducted a browse of www.accurint.com for THOMAS ROBINSON and found that in addition to being associated with the address on Holland Road, he was also associated with 229 Locust Lane, State College, PA 16801, the same address as the DU Fraternity House.

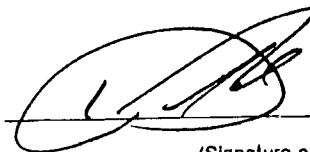

34. On 11/14/24, CI #4105-24 was then followed to the DU Fraternity House. At all times, CI #4105-24 was under constant surveillance. As CI #4105-24 approached the east facing door on the southeast corner of the building, Detective R. Plunkett and Detective Federinko observed CI #4105-24 enter the residence. Approximately (1) minute later, CI #4105-24 was observed exiting the same door. CI #4105-24 met with your affiant and immediately handed your affiant a bag containing suspected cocaine.

35. On 11/14/24, CI #4105-24 advised the officers that when he/she arrived THOMAS ROBINSON opened the door, and CI #4105-24 met with him just inside the door. THOMAS ROBINSON handed CI #4105-24 a zip lock bag containing suspected cocaine. CI #4105-24 handed THOMAS ROBINSON the known amount of pre-recorded U.S. currency. THOMAS ROBINSON accepted the currency as payment for the suspected cocaine. CI #4105-24 then exited the residence.

36. Your affiant corroborated the information CI #4105-24 provided by again having CI #4105-24 searched. CI #4105-24 was determined to be free of any currency, contraband, and/or controlled substances.

37. On 11/14/24, Detective R. Plunkett field tested the suspected cocaine that was purchased from THOMAS ROBINSON. Using a NIK test kit the suspected cocaine was positive for the presence of cocaine. The suspected cocaine was subsequently entered into SCPD evidence to be forwarded to the lab for further analysis.

38. On 11/14/24, your affiant also reviewed the data from the audio/video recording device which corroborated CI #4105-24's statements.

39. During the month of December 2024, your affiant was able to develop another Informant, Confidential Informant #4138-24 (hereinafter referred to as CI #4138-24), who has knowledge of Tom Robinson and his drug distribution in the State College area. CI #4138-24 informed your affiant that during the month of September 2024 "Tom Robinson" was selling cocaine in the State College area. CI #4138-24 has purchased drugs from Tom Robinson approximately 10-20 times in the past and has purchased cocaine from "Tom Robinson" at "Tom Robinson's" room inside the DU Fraternity House. The CI advised that "Tom Robinson" is using cell phone number: 412-926-6694 and Snapchat user ID: "To_Rob". CI #4138-24 told the Officers that "Tom Robinson" is living at the DU Fraternity House. The CI could not recall the exact room number but stated it is either 18 or 19. Based on the above corroborating information, "Tom Robinson" was identified as the same THOMAS ROBINSON living at the DU Fraternity House.

40. On 12/10/24, your affiant completed an application to intercept communications between CI #4138-24 and THOMAS ROBINSON. CI #4138-24 spoke with Deputy Attorney General David Gorman and Deputy Attorney General David Gorman approved the interception.

41. On 12/11/24, Deputy Attorney General David Gorman and your affiant then met with Judge Brian Marshall. Judge Marshall signed a court order authorizing the interception of communications between CI #4138-24 and THOMAS ROBINSON within THOMAS ROBINSON's residence, the DU Fraternity House.

42. On 12/09/24, THOMAS ROBINSON contacted CI #4105-24 via Snapchat and asked CI #4105-24 if he/she "needed some for this week". CI #4105-24 knew the intent of the message and THOMAS ROBINSON was asking CI #4105-24 if he/she wanted to purchase more cocaine this week. It should be noted that CI #4105-24 was only buying quantities larger than 1/2 ounce of cocaine and THOMAS ROBINSON told CI #4105-24 that he will not sell any quantity smaller than a half ounce of cocaine.

43. On 12/12/24, CI #4138-24 contacted THOMAS ROBINSON (via Snapchat text messages) and made arrangements to purchase suspected cocaine from THOMAS ROBINSON. Your affiant corroborated the information CI #4138-24 provided by viewing and documenting the text messages after the communications occurred. Your affiant and additional officers met with CI #4138-24 prior to conducting the controlled purchase of cocaine from THOMAS ROBINSON.

44. On 12/12/24, your affiant had CI #4138-24 searched. CI #4138-24 was free of any currency, contraband, and/or controlled substances. CI #4138-24 was then provided with a known amount of pre-recorded US currency and an audio/video recording device.

45. On 12/12/24, CI #4138-24 was then followed to the DU Fraternity House. At all times, CI #4138-24 was under constant surveillance. As CI #4138-24 approached the east facing door on the southeast corner of the building, Detective R. Plunkett and observed CI #4138-24 enter the residence. Approximately (23) minute later, CI #4138-24 was observed exiting the same door by Detective R. Plunkett. CI #4138-24 met with your affiant and immediately handed your affiant a bag containing suspected cocaine.

Once inside the room, THOMAS ROBINSON opened a safe in room, removed the bag of cocaine from the safe and handed it to CI #4138-24 and CI #4138-24 handed THOMAS ROBINSON the known quantity of pre-recorded U.S. currency. THOMAS ROBINSON accepted the currency as payment for the cocaine.

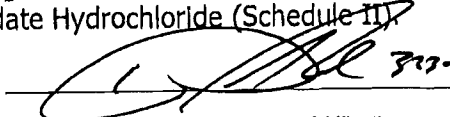
47. On 12/12/24, your affiant corroborated the information CI #4138-24 provided by again having CI #4138-24 searched. CI #4138-24 was determined to be free of any currency, contraband, and/or controlled substances. Detective R. Plunkett weighed, and field tested the suspected cocaine that was purchased from THOMAS ROBINSON. Using a NIK test kit the suspected cocaine was positive for the presence of cocaine. The suspected cocaine was subsequently entered into SCPD evidence to be forwarded to the lab for further analysis.

48. Based on the aforementioned facts and circumstances, your affiant applied for and obtained a search warrant for THOMAS ROBINSON room inside the Delta Upsilon Fraternity House located at 229 Locust Lane, Room #18, State College, Centre County, Pennsylvania. The search warrant was approved/signed by Judge Jonathan Grine.

49. On 12/13/24, your affiant and additional officers executed the search warrant. Upon entering room #18, THOMAS ROBINSON was located on the bed inside the room. He was the sole occupant of the room. Officers attempted to place handcuffs on THOMAS ROBINSON, however, he continued to resist with his hands hidden under his body and repeatedly told officers "I'm gonna fuck you up". Through the use of a taser, officers were able to get THOMAS ROBINSON's hands behind his back and handcuffs. After he was handcuffed and officers were escorting him out of the room, THOMAS ROBINSON stated he thought the officers were his fraternity brothers playing a prank on him.

50. On 12/13/24, the search of THOMAS ROBINSON's room yielded the following items.

- 1) An Apple cell phone was located on the floor beside the bed.
- 2) \$44 in US currency was located in a wallet on the floor beside the bed.
- 3) Suspected marijuana was located inside a grinder on a shelf beside the bed. This suspected marijuana was weighed and weighed of (4) grams. Detective Federinko conducted a field test of a sample of the suspected marijuana using a NIK test kit which had a positive result for the presence of tetrahydrocannabinol (THC). This suspected marijuana was packaged per SCPD policy and entered into evidence to be forwarded to the Pennsylvania State Police Regional Laboratory for further analysis.
- 4) (2) grinders containing suspected marijuana and a large glass bong containing suspected marijuana residue were located on a shelf beside the bed.
- 5) A pill bottle containing (2) pills was located on a shelf in the closet. Each pill was imprinted with "TL 709". Your affiant subsequently conducted a browse of www.drugs.com and located pills of the same shape, size, color, and imprint. The pills were identified as Methylphenidate Hydrochloride (Schedule II).

6) On a table at the foot of the bed, a large bag containing suspected marijuana was located. This suspected marijuana was weighed and had a total package weight of (220) grams. Detective Federinko conducted a field test of a sample of the suspected marijuana using a NIK test kit which had a positive result for the presence of tetrahydrocannabinol (THC). This suspected marijuana was packaged per SCPD policy and entered into evidence to be forwarded to the Pennsylvania State Police Regional Laboratory for further analysis.

7) A digital scale containing suspected marijuana residue was located on the table at the foot of the bed.

8) A safe was located on top of the mini refrigerator. Inside the safe was a Kimber .45 caliber handgun. There was magazine inside the magazine port containing (7) rounds of ammunition. It should be noted this handgun was next to suspected cocaine and pills. Your affiant attempted to locate ownership of the handgun or any record of sale with negative results.

9) A safe was located on top of the mini refrigerator. Inside the safe, a sandwich sized bag containing suspected cocaine next to the handgun. Detective Federinko conducted a field test of a sample of the suspected cocaine using a NIK test kit which had a positive result for the presence of cocaine. This suspected cocaine was weighed and had a total package weight of (8.2) grams. This suspected cocaine was packaged per SCPD policy and entered into evidence to be forwarded to the Pennsylvania State Police Regional Laboratory for further analysis.

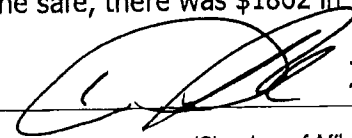
10) A safe was located on top of the mini refrigerator. Inside the safe, a zip lock bag containing three different types of pills each package in a separate bag.

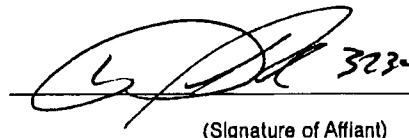

Over a period of approximately (3) months, five controlled purchases of cocaine have been conducted from THOMAS ROBINSON and he has offered to sell one of the informants involved in the investigation over an ounce of cocaine. In addition, the informant is aware the THOMAS ROBINSON has been selling cocaine to others. With the proximity of the handgun in the same safe as the drugs and US currency, your affiant believes a nexus can reasonably be drawn to indicate the handgun was present to facilitate the sale of these controlled substances.
