IMPORTANT NOTICE

TO: JEFFREY S. JOY:

You are hereby notified that the Pennsylvania Judicial Conduct Board has determined there is probable cause to file formal charges against you for conduct proscribed by Article V, §17(b) and §18(d)(1) of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the Rules Governing Standards of Conduct of Magisterial District Judges. The Board's counsel will present the case in support of the charges before the Pennsylvania Court of Judicial Discipline.

You have an absolute right to be represented by a lawyer in all proceedings before the Court of Judicial Discipline. Your attorney should file an entry of appearance with the Court of Judicial Discipline within fifteen (15) days of service of this Board Complaint in accordance with C.J.D.R.P. No. 110.

You are hereby notified, pursuant to C.J.D.R.P. No. 302(B), that should you elect to file an omnibus motion, that motion should be filed

no later than thirty (30) days after the service of this Complaint in accordance with C.J.D.R.P. No. 411.

You are further hereby notified that within thirty (30) days after the service of this Complaint, if no omnibus motion is filed, or within twenty (20) days after the dismissal of all or part of the omnibus motion, you may file an Answer admitting or denying the allegations contained in this Complaint in accordance with C.J.D.R.P. No. 413. Failure to file an Answer shall be deemed a denial of all factual allegations in the Complaint.

COMPLAINT

AND NOW, this 17th day of June 2016, comes the Judicial Conduct Board of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania (hereinafter "Board") and files this Board Complaint against Jeffrey S. Joy, former Magisterial District Judge, York County, Pennsylvania, alleging that Mr. Joy violated the Rules Governing Standards of Conduct of Magisterial District Judges and §18(d)(1) of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, as more specifically delineated herein.

- Article V, §18 of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania grants the Board authority to determine whether there is probable cause to file formal charges, and, when it concludes that probable cause exists, to file formal charges against a justice, judge, or justice of the peace for proscribed conduct and to present the case in support of such charges before the Court of Judicial Discipline.
- From January 2012 until August 7, 2015, Mr. Joy served continuously as a duly elected Magisterial District Judge for Magisterial District 19-3-04 in York County, Nineteenth Judicial District, Pennsylvania, encompassing the Townships of Shrewsbury and Springfield, Boroughs of Glen Rock, Jacobus, Loganville, New Freedom, Railroad and Shrewsbury.

- By Administrative Order dated August 7, 2015, York County
 President Judge Stephen P. Linebaugh removed Mr. Joy from
 handling all Magisterial District Judge duties until further order of
 the Court.
- On August 13, 2015, the Board filed a Petition For Interim
 Suspension With or Without Pay against Mr. Joy. By Order dated
 August 17, 2015, this Court suspended Mr. Joy without pay.
- As a duly elected Magisterial District Judge, Mr. Joy was at all times relevant hereto subject to all the duties and responsibilities imposed on him by the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the Rules Governing Standards of Conduct of Magisterial District Judges adopted by the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania.

PART I:

- On August 7, 2015, the Pennsylvania State Police, with the approval of the Pennsylvania Office of Attorney General, charged Mr. Joy with the following criminal offenses:
 - Official Oppression, 18 Pa.C.S.A. §5301(1), a misdemeanor of the second degree;
 - (2) Indecent Assault, 18 Pa.C.S.A. §3126(a)(1), a misdemeanor of the second degree;

- (3) Harassment, 18 Pa.C.S.A. §2709(a)(4), a misdemeanor of the third degree; and
- (4) Harassment, 18 Pa.C.S.A. §2709(a)(1), a summary offense.

A true and correct copy of the Criminal Complaint is attached hereto, incorporated by reference, and marked as Board's Exhibit "A."

- On August 12, 2015, the Pennsylvania State Police, with the approval of the Pennsylvania Office of Attorney General, filed the following additional criminal charges against Magisterial District Judge Joy:
 - Bribery in Official and Political Matters, 18 Pa.C.S.A.
 §4701(a)(2), a felony of the third degree;
 - (2) Bribery in Official and Political Matters, 18 Pa.C.S.A. §4701(a)(3), a felony of the third degree;
 - (3) Official Oppression, 18 Pa.C.S.A. §5301(1), a misdemeanor of the second degree;
 - (4) Harassment, 18 Pa.C.S.A. §2709(a)(4), a misdemeanor of the third degree; and
 - (5) Harassment, 18 Pa.C.S.A. §2709(a)(7), a misdemeanor of the third degree.

A true and correct copy of the Criminal Complaint is attached hereto, incorporated by reference, and marked as Board's Exhibit "B."

- 8. Following a combined preliminary hearing on both cases held on September 18, 2015, Senior Magisterial District Judge John Zepp held all charges for court. A true and correct copy of the magisterial district judge docket entries regarding Commonwealth v. Jeffrey S. Joy, MJ-19301-CR-000342-2015, and Commonwealth v. Jeffrey S. Joy, MJ-19301-CR-000348-2015, is attached hereto, incorporated by reference, and marked as Board's Exhibit "C."
- The matters proceeded to the York County Court of Common Pleas.
 True and correct copies of the docket entries regarding
 Commonwealth v. Jeffrey S. Joy, CP-67-CR-0006006-2015, and
 Commonwealth v. Jeffrey S. Joy, CP-67-CR-0006007-2015, are
 attached hereto, incorporated by reference, and marked as Board's
 Exhibit "D."
- On April 27, 2016, pursuant to a plea agreement, Mr. Joy pled no contest at Commonwealth v. Jeffrey S. Joy, CP-67-CR-0006006-2015, to Count 3, Official Oppression, a misdemeanor of the second degree.
 Mr. Joy also pled no contest at Commonwealth v. Jeffrey S. Joy, CP-67-CR-0006007-2015, to Count 1, Official Oppression, a misdemeanor

of the second degree. The Honorable Lawrence F. Clark, Jr., Senior Judge, sentenced Mr. Joy in the aggregate to two years' probation, 200 hours of community service, to pay the costs of prosecution and a fine of \$2,000.00. Senior Judge Clark also directed that within 24 hours Mr. Joy was to tender to the Governor of the Commonwealth, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, and the Pennsylvania Secretary of State, an unequivocal, non-revocable, resignation from judicial office which acknowledges that Mr. Joy will not seek or accept a judicial or law enforcement office in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania for the duration of his natural life. A true and correct copy of the Plea and Sentence transcript is attached hereto, incorporated by reference, and marked as Board's Exhibit "E."

- 11. During the plea and sentencing proceeding on April 27, 2016, the Commonwealth put on the record a factual basis for each plea at each docket as follows:
 - a. Commonwealth v. Jeffrey S. Joy, CP-67-CR-0006006-2015

Okay. On Docket 6006 of 2015, the offense occurred at 28 Berkshire drive in Shrewsbury Borough, York County, Pennsylvania, and on or about December 1st, 2014, at that date the Defendant did take advantage of his official capacity as a Magisterial District Judge of York County, Pennsylvania, by infringing on the rights of the victim in this case identified as an adult female, A.P.M. are her initials, by demanding that she model items of lingerie clothing at her residence in exchange for vacating her outstanding fines and costs.

b. Commonwealth v. Jeffrey S. Joy, CP-67-CR-0006007-2015

Then on 6007 of 2015, at 28 Water Street, Apartment 34 in Glen Rock Borough, York County, Pennsylvania, on or about March 4th, 2015, the Defendant was present at that location and did again take advantage of his official capacity as a Magisterial District Judge of York County, Pennsylvania, by subjecting the victim in this case she is identified with the initials M.C. to mistreatment from the – in the form of unwanted sexual contact.

See Board's Exhibit "E," Id.

12. In making his plea of no contest, Mr. Joy acknowledged understanding the factual bases for his pleas at docket numbers CP-67-CR-0006006-2015 and CP-67-CR-0006007-2015 and acknowledged that although he was not admitting to those facts, he understood that his plea of no contest would be treated as equivalent to a guilty plea for purposes of sentencing:

THE COURT: Okay. Do you further understand that although you are not admitting to these facts, that a plea of no contest is treated for the purposes of sentencing and the outcome of these cases as a plea of guilty, do you understand that?

THE DEFENDANT: Yes, Your Honor.

THE COURT: Okay. Do you understand the nature of the allegation against you at Docket 6006, which is Count No. 3, as described by the Commonwealth's attorney, that being a count of misdemeanor graded official oppression, do you understand that charge against you?

THE DEFENDANT: Yes, Your Honor.

THE COURT: And to that charge how do you plead?

THE DEFENDANT: No contest.

THE COURT: And, similarly, as to Count No. 1 at Docket 6007, do you understand the basis of that plea or that allegation against you?

THE DEFENDANT: Yes, Your Honor.

THE COURT: And to that charge how do you plead?

THE DEFENDANT: No contest.

- 13. By letter dated April 28, 2016, Mr. Joy gave notice to Governor Tom Wolf and Chief Justice Thomas Saylor that he was resigning as magisterial district judge effective immediately and would not seek any judicial or law enforcement office in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. This letter was also provided to the Pennsylvania Secretary of State, Pedro A. Cortés. A true and correct copy of Mr. Joy's letter to Governor Tom Wolf and Chief Justice Thomas Saylor is attached hereto, incorporated by reference, and marked as Board's Exhibit "F."
- Mr. Joy's criminal convictions have become final and he has filed no appeal.

15. By virtue of his convictions for two counts of Official Oppression, misdemeanors of the second degree, Mr. Joy is subject to discipline under the Pennsylvania Constitution.

PART II. CHARGES:

- 16. By virtue of some or all of the facts collectively set forth at Part I, Mr. Joy is subject to discipline for violating the Rules Governing Standards of Conduct of Magisterial District Judges (effective December 1, 2014) and the Pennsylvania Constitution as follows:
 - Count 1: By virtue of his convictions for two counts of Official Oppression, misdemeanors of the second degree, Mr. Joy has violated Canon 2, Rule 2.4(B) of the Rules Governing Standards of Conduct of Magisterial District Judges, which provides: "A magisterial district judge shall not permit family, social, political, financial, or other interests or relationships to influence the magisterial district judge's judicial conduct or judgment."
 - Count 2: By virtue of his convictions for two counts of Official
 Oppression, misdemeanors of the second degree, Mr. Joy has
 violated Canon 3, Rule 3.9A(1) of the Rules Governing
 Standards of Conduct of Magisterial District Judges, which

provides: "Magisterial district judges and all employees assigned to or appointed by magisterial district judges shall not engage, directly or indirectly, in any activity or act incompatible with the expeditious, proper and impartial discharge of their duties, including, but not limited to, (1) in any activity prohibited by law."

Count 3: By virtue of his convictions for two counts of Official Oppression, misdemeanors of the second degree, and also based on his violations of Canon 1, Rule 1.1, Canon 2, Rule 2.4(B), and Canon 3, Rule 3.9A(1), Mr. Joy has violated Canon 1, Rule 1.2 of the Rules Governing Standards of Conduct of Magisterial District Judges, which provides: "A magisterial district judge shall act at all times in a manner that promotes public confidence in the independence, integrity, and impartiality of the judiciary, and shall avoid impropriety and the appearance of impropriety."

Count 4: By virtue of his convictions for two counts of Official Oppression, misdemeanors of the second degree, and also based on his violations of Canon 1, Rule 1.2, Canon 2, Rule 2.4(B), and Canon 3, Rule 3.9A(1), Mr. Joy has violated Canon 1, Rule 1.1 of the Rules Governing Standards of

Conduct of Magisterial District Judges, which provides: "A magisterial district judge shall comply with the law, including the Rules Governing Standards of Conduct of Magisterial District Judges."

Count 5: By virtue of his convictions for two counts of Official Oppression, misdemeanors of the second degree, Mr. Joy has violated Article V, §18(d)(1) of the Pennsylvania Constitution by engaging in conduct "in violation of a canon or rule prescribed by the Supreme Court."

Count 6: By virtue of his convictions for two counts of Official Oppression, misdemeanors of the second degree, Mr. Joy has violated Article V, §18(d)(1) of the Pennsylvania Constitution by engaging in conduct which "brings the judicial office into disrepute, whether or not the conduct occurred while acting in a judicial capacity or is prohibited by law."

WHEREFORE, Mr. Joy, a former Magisterial District Judge of York County, Pennsylvania, is subject to disciplinary action pursuant to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Article V, §18(d)(1).

AFFIDAVIT of PROBABLE CAUSE

Your affiant is a Pennsylvania State Trooper currently assigned to the Criminal Investigation Unit, Troop H York Station. I have been a member of the Pennsylvania State Police since December of 2005 and have been in the Criminal Investigation Unit since October of 2011. In that time I have conducted numerous sexual assault investigations that have resulted in successful prosecution. Additionally, I have investigated major and complex incidents including homicides, police involved shootings, other violent crimes such as attempted homicides and robberies, and financial crimes. I have also received extensive training in interviewing techniques.

On 03/04/15 I was assigned to investigate an incident involving an adult female victim identified in this document as "M.C." (DOB: 04/26/84) who reported she was sexually assaulted by the defendant, York County Magisterial District Judge Jeffrey Scott JOY. At the time of this incident, M.C. resided at 28 Water St., Apt # 4, Glen Rock Boro., York County which is location where the incident is alleged to have occurred.

According to publicly available records, the defendant has served as Magisterial District Judge presiding over District Court 19-3-04 beginning in January of 2012 after being elected to that position on November 8th, 2011. The defendant has served in this official capacity through the present date. Additionally, the defendant's public safety experience includes serving ten years as the former chairman of the Southern Police Commission. He also served as the former Mayor of New Freedom Borough for ten years and was previously a dispatcher with York County 911 for two years.

The following are the facts of this case developed primarily from personal interviews that were conducted with the victim, the defendant, and other witnesses identified through this investigation who were able to illustrate an ongoing course of conduct and mistreatment relative to the defendant's interactions with female court participants, and who further corroborate the victim's allegations:

On 03/04/15 at 1933 hours, your affiant conducted an interview with the victim M.C. at the PSP York Station. M.C. related that she first met MDJ JOY on 02/19/15 at District Court 19-3-04 while she was under subpoena as a victim/witness for the Commonwealth for a criminal case involving her boyfriend V. MATTHEWS, who was the case defendant. In a negotiated plea agreement, MATTHEWS plead guilty to two summary Non-Traffic violations for Disorderly Conduct and Harassment. In exchange, the misdemeanor charge of Simple Assault was withdrawn. As a result of the plea, District Court 19-3-04 maintained control of this case because MATTHEWS owed JOY'S court in excess of \$1,000 in fines and costs. Although the MATHEWS case was adjudicated, he remained in the custody of York County Prison indefinitely due to a probation violation and was attempting to gain approval for the work release program.

After the court proceeding described above, M.C. said she approached JOY and reported an incident involving her suspicion that child abuse was occurring in an adjoining apartment. M.C. informed JOY that she could hear the abuse occurring through the walls of her apartment. JOY provided her with his business card and advised M.C. to contact him if she heard anything else.

M.C. related that during the afternoon hours of 02/19/15 (after the above referenced preliminary hearing concluded), JOY drove his personal vehicle to the apartments located at 28 Water Street and encountered M.C. outside. At first, M.C. said she didn't recognize JOY until he identified himself as "Judge Joy." M.C. said she and JOY conversed briefly and he asked M.C. if he could come inside her apartment to talk. Once M.C. allowed JOY inside, she suggested having her next door neighbor come over so that the neighbor could provide additional information regarding the child abuse matter. JOY told M.C. that he didn't want anyone to know he was there because he was attempting to confirm M.C.'s earlier report that the alleged child abuse could be heard from inside the walls of her apartment. During this encounter, M.C. related both she and JOY did in fact hear yelling through the walls by an adult from the downstairs apartment in question. According to M.C., JOY stayed at her apartment for approximately 20-30 minutes. Prior to JOY leaving, M.C. said JOY asked her if she needed any money for rent or food. He also asked about her workout routine and commented that she had a nice body. JOY hugged M.C. and told her to call him if she needed anything or heard anything further. M.C. related in her statement that she felt uncomfortable with this encounter.

M.C. then reported that on 03/04/15 at 1454 hours, she received a phone call from the District Court 19-3-04 office number. M.C. answered this phone call, which was placed by JOY. The call lasted 8 minutes. JOY initially advised M.C. that she needed to provide a formal statement to the Southern Regional Police Department regarding the alleged child abuse case. The conversation then developed into JOY asking about M.C.'S finances and wellbeing. She indicated she was struggling and needed to find another part time job. JOY then asked if she had any artwork for sale. M.C. responded affirmatively, and sald JOY asked if he could stop by later and buy a painting to help her out financially. M.C. agreed to this request.

On 03/04/15 at approximately 1615-1630 hours, M.C. sald JOY arrived at her apartment. She allowed him inside and began showing him her artwork. M.C. Indicated that JOY asked her repeatedly If she had any self-portraits that displayed her tattoos. She told JOY she did not, but said she had custom pin-up drawings that resemble her. M.C. then showed JOY one of the custom pinups that were on her computer. This particular pin-up girl was posed in a sexually suggestive position while wearing a pair of stockings, which became the topic of conversation. M.C. indicated that she had a similar pair of stockings and said that JOY asked her to put them on. M.C. related she initially said no to this request, but began to fear that if she upset JOY, then her boyfriend could face additional punishment for his criminal cases. M.C. then walked to her bedroom to change and closed the bedroom door. M.C. said that JOY walked back to her bedroom uninvited, opened the door and entered her bedroom while she was pulling the stockings up wearing only underwear and a shirt. M.C. said she panicked and reached into her closel to find clothes to cover herself. She said JOY approached her and groped her backside and breast and then offered her "\$150.00" to take off her shirt so that he could see her tattoos without clothing. M.C. said she refused, but advised that JOY pulled up her shirt anyway and licked her breasts. M.C. reported that the described sexual contact occurred without her permission or consent. M.C. said she ran out of the room and opened the front door for JOY to leave. Immediately following the sexual encounter, she reported what occurred to her next door neighbor and made a prompt complaint to PSP the same evening.

On 03/05/15 at 1057 hours, I interviewed JOY relative to this investigation. He said he first met M.C. through District Court proceedings and acknowledged that he traveled to M.C.'s apartment on 02/19/15 and 03/04/15, confirming M.C.'s statement with a relative degree of consistency regarding their personal and phone interactions. However, when JOY was questioned about the critical event regarding an alleged sexual encounter with M.C., he was evasive and deceptive. As evidence, JOY provided three different versions of the same event. In his first statement detailing the encounter, JOY said he drove to M.C.'S apartment on 03/04/15 and arrived between 1615-1630 hours. He said M.C. allowed him inside and began showing him some of the pictures that she had in her apartment. JOY noted that M.C. was wearing stockings when he first saw her. JOY said he wasn't interested in any of the pictures initially shown to him because they were strange and gothic in style. He said M.C. offered to do custom work for him, and they eventually started looking at a picture on M.C.'S phone of a female wearing stockings while in a sexually suggestive position. JOY said they started talking about these particular stockings, but said it was actually M.C. who offered to put on a similar pair. JOY indicated that M.C. went back into her bedroom to change. He said they continued to talk while M.C. was in her bedroom and he was in another room, JOY initially stated that M.C. "called him back there" indicating that she requested him to come back to the bedroom. He said he walked back to the bedroom and saw that M.C. now had a different pair of stockings on and that she was wearing only underwear and a shirt. JOY contended that M.C. "took her shirt off" voluntarily as he stood there looking at her. He said he thought to himself, "this isn't good," yet said he stayed for a couple more minutes. He concluded by stating that, "I wish I wouldn't have went. Let's put it that way, but nothing happened. No crime was committed. I shouldn't even have gotten involved and been there."

Upon questioning JOY further, he provided a second version of events that differed from his initial account. JOY related that he was standing in the computer room conversing with M.C. while she was changing in her bedroom. This time he said he was having trouble hearing her, so he decided to walk back to the bedroom (he made no mention that M.C. asked him to come back during this version). JOY said the door was open, and observed M.C. putting stockings on while wearing only underwear and a black tee shirt. JOY said M.C. then put on a pair of "short shorts" and modeled them a little bit. After that, JOY said M.C. took her shirt off without being prompted and he observed her to be nude from the waist up. I then asked JOY if he had any conversation with M.C. at that point. He said he asked M.C., "okay to touch?" JOY sald M.C. responded by saying "Okay." JOY then admitted that he reached over and touched M.C.'S exposed breast. JOY again told me that he realized this was wrong, and that he needed to leave. JOY said he left "within a matter of minutes" and claimed that wrong, and that he needed to leave. I then asked JOY if anything else happened between him and M.C. He responded, "I think that was it." After informing JOY that M.C. was taken to York Hospital where body swabs were collected for DNA, I asked him if he would be able to explain it if his saliva or DNA was found on her chest or body. In response to this question, JOY then provided a third version of events and stated, "I may have kissed her breast." JOY insisted that this was the extent of the physical contact he had with M.C. He believed the encounter to be consensual, and stated he was not at the apartment in a judicial capacity; but admitted that he shouldn't have gotten involved or been [to M.C.'s apartment].

JOY also refuted M.C.'s claim that he offered her \$150 dollars to remove her clothing. He explained that he only had a few dollars on him, even though his initial reasoning for why he went to M.C.'S apartment was specifically to purchase artwork to help her financial situation.

Furthermore, JOY stated that the above described encounters with M.C. were the only occasions where he made personal visits a court participant at their home. This answer was later determined to be a lie after your affiant interviewed an adult female identified as "R.D." (DOB: 12/28/90). R.D. advised that she has been in Judge JOY'S court as a defendant on several occasions, and only knew him from in-court appearances. She recalled a 2013 hearing where JOY told her she was "too pretty" to be in his court for drug charges and said JOY referred to her as being pretly more than once during the hearing. After this hearing, R.D. sald JOY made two or three personal visits to her apartment. She said JOY sometimes stayed at her apartment for 1-2 hours. R.D. said she still had active cases in JOY'S court at the time of these personal visits where she owed fines. During his personal visits to her home, R.D. said JOY would ask how she was doing financially and provided her and her mother information regarding local services that could assist them. R.D. thought it was unusual for a MDJ to visit a court defendant at their apartment, especially when she had active cases, and said that the information he provided to her was something that could have been done in court. R.D. also described a conversation that occurred at her home where JOY offered to take her and her mother out to Red Lobster if she stayed out of trouble. She said JOY called her cell phone on more than one occasions to check on her well-being and to see if she needed a ride for court appearances or community service. R.D. said JOY never made any sexual advances towards her, but added that her mother was always present on the occasions when JOY came to her apartment. R.D. described JOY as being "overly caring." She thought it was unusual and said it was "too much" for a Judge to be that concerned for her well-being.

Additionally, investigators from the Judicial Conduct Board met with an adult female identified as "G.O." (DOB: 11/15/88). G.O. also reported that she only knew JOY by appearing before him in court. In her statement, G.O. Indicated that she appeared before JOY on three separate occasions beginning in 2014, and described a series of unusual and inappropriate behavior and comments made by JOY towards her all stemming from in-court appearances. According to G.O., during a traffic violation hearing JOY said to her in open court, "This officer did you a favor because you are a pretty girl." G.O. said she felt uncomfortable since it was only the judge, the officer, and G.O. in the courtroom. Then, on January 8th, 2015, G.O. said she and JOY were alone together in the courtroom of District Court 19-3-04 when JOY made inappropriate sexual comments to her at the conclusion of a hearing intended to resolve a fine payment issue. G.O. said that she was called to the bench by JOY, and he asked her if she uses drugs. G.O. said she did not use drugs and hardly drinks, JOY then asked G.O. if she smokes. G.O. responded affirmatively, but said she wished she didn't. JOY then replied, "You know that they say about girls that smoke?" G.O. replied, "No." JOY said, "They like things in their mouths, do you like things in your mouth?" G.O. reported she was taken aback by what JOY just said to her and replied, "I like candy." JOY then said, "Is that all?" G.O. also said JOY commented about how they would have fun if they attended a party together, but admitted that she could not remember the exact words because she was upset and wanted to leave, G.O. stated she was so "disgusted and flustered" that she asked if she was excused and left the courtroom.

During the aforementioned interview with JOY, he had also stated that he referred the alleged child abuse incident to Detective SHAFER of the Southern Regional Police Department and to Childline on 02/20/15, JOY Indicated that approximately one week later (02/26/15), he was notified that York County Children Youth and Families investigated and closed the child abuse investigation due to a lack of disclosure by both the victim and alleged perpetrator.

In an effort to confirm JOY'S account of his report to law enforcement, your affiant conducted interviews with Detective William SHAFER and Officer Michael STOREMAN of the Southern Regional Police Department. Both Detective SHAFER and Officer STOREMAN recall JOY making a request for Investigation to their agency regarding an alleged child abuse case on or about 02/20/15. However, the officers were never notified by JOY that he went to M.C.'s apartment and conducted an investigation, and JOY never reported his observations that he overheard yelling and commotion in the downstairs apartment on 02/19/15.

Criminal charges contained within the attached criminal complaint were approved by the Office of Altorney General which has assumed jurisdiction of this prosecution under the Commonwealth Attorneys Act. Your affiant believes the above information establishes probable cause for the charges listed in the preceding criminal complaint, and believes the information contained within this document to be true and correct. I respectfully request the initiation of due process for the defendant, Jeffrey Scott JOY.

AFFIDAVIT of PROBABLE CAUSE

Your affiant is a Pennsylvania State Trooper currently assigned to the Criminal Investigation Unit, Troop H York Station. I have been a member of the Pennsylvania State Police since December of 2005 and have been in the Criminal Investigation Unit since October of 2011. In that time I have conducted numerous sexual assault investigations that have resulted in successful prosecution. Additionally, I have investigated major and complex incidents including homicides, police involved shootings, other violent crimes such as attempted homicides and robberies, and financial crimes.

On 03/04/15, The Pennsylvania State Police initiated an investigation into allegations that the defendant, Magisterial District Judge Jeffrey Scott JOY of District Court 19-3-04, sexually assaulted an adult female court participant at the female victim's home. As a result of the investigation, criminal charges of Indecent Assault, Official Oppression, and Harassment were filed against the defendant on 08/07/15. The Office of Attorney General and the Pennsylvania State Police disseminated public information releases containing the basic facts of the case, and this information was made available to the public by local media outlets.

On Monday 08/10/15 at approximately 1620 hours, your afflant was walking through the station parking lot after completing my assigned shift. At this time, I observed a female parked in a white four-door station wagon in the visitors parking area. I noticed that the female appeared noticeably anxious and nervous. I approached the female and asked her if she needed assistance. The female, later identified as "A.P.M" (DOB: 10/29/75) by way of her PA driver's license, asked if I was a police officer and stated that she needed to speak with someone regarding Magisterial District Judge Jeffrey JOY. After explaining to A.P.M that I was the investigator assigned to the JOY case, she provided a statement to me regarding encounters she had with Judge JOY that were similar to what she read about in the news.

A.P.M. related that she was charged with misdemeanor Simple Assault and summary Harassment in September of 2014 stemming from a domestic dispute with her boyfriend. She later appeared before Magisterial District Judge JOY and pleaded guilty to summary Harassment. A.P.M. said she was ordered to pay fines and costs as the result of her guilty plea. She also indicated that her boyfriend lived at an out-of-state address, which is information that would have been known to JOY. A.P.M indicated she was employed as an adult dancer at a business in a neighboring county at that time.

A.P.M. then said that in December of 2014, she traveled back to District Court 19-3-04 to request restructuring of her fine payment plan. She said she went before JOY who granted her request and engaged her in conversation about her children. Part of the conversation included JOY inquiring as the whether her son would be interested in joining a local youth basketball program. JOY also inquired as to her employment.

After the fine payment hearing (determined from AOPC court records to be 12/01/14), A.P.M. said she returned home. That evening, A.P.M. advised that JOY showed up by himself at her home in Shrewsbury Borough, York County. She said that her son and daughter were present at this time, and that her daughter answered the front door and allowed JOY into the foyer area. A.P.M. said she was shocked that the Judge came to her home and said she never invited the Judge to her house or provided him with her contact information for personal use. She believed that JOY used the information contained in her court paperwork to obtain her address and phone number. A.P.M. said she and JOY initially began conversing about her son's interest in joining a youth basketball league, which she later believed was his "guise" for coming to her home. A.P.M. then related that JOY then asked if she still had her court paperwork available. A.P.M. said she told JOY her documents were in the kitchen. They walked into the kitchen where JOY reviewed her paperwork. A.P.M. then stated that JOY then offered to vacate her court fines and expunge her criminal record provided she would "model" items of lingerie clothing (of the type she wore for exotic dancing) for him, A.P.M. related it was her belief that this was a guid pro quo type offer. A.P.M. said she refused, and reminded JOY that her children were nearby. She said JOY left shortly after.

AFFIDAVIT of PROBABLE CAUSE CONTINUATION

A.P.M. provided PSP with a signed written statement detailing her knowledge of this incident. A.P.M further corroborated her statement when she showed PSP an email record she sent to an acquaintance dated 12/01/14. In the body of the email, A.P.M. describes her unusual and inappropriate encounter with Judge JOY from earlier in the day and asked for advice.

A.P.M. said that after the above described encounter with JOY, she began receiving numerous phone calls to her cell phone from blocked numbers, and believed it was the JOY calling. A.P.M. said she was afraid to answer phone calls from unknown numbers because of the previously described encounter, and said she did not want to continue any type of communication with JOY. A.P.M. said JOY also left her at least 2-3 volcemail messages between 12/01/14 – 12/09/14. In each message, she said JOY again inquired about her son joining youth basketball. A.P.M. said that at least one of the phone calls made by JOY were from his home phone. A.P.M. provided PSP with her phone records which reveal that a phone call was placed from a 10 digit number your affiant knows to be consistent with the home phone number of Jeffrey JOY. The communication log was dated 12/02/14 at 4:11 PM.

A.P.M. further reported that she went out of town on 12/09/14. She said she explained to her children's babysitter, identified as adult female B.L.F. (DOB: 11/21/96) to beware of the Judge from her court case. A.P.M. said she told her babysitter she thought JOY was stalking her and explained the basic details of her encounters with JOY. A.P.M. said she advised the babysitter not to answer the door or allow JOY to enter if he showed up at the house. A.P.M. advised that on 12/09/14 at approximately 1610 hours, JOY showed up at her house while she was out of town. A.P.M. reported that she was actually speaking on the phone with B.L.F. when JOY arrived. She said B.L.F. ordered JOY off the premises and that she took a cell phone image of his blue Chevrolet SUV parked out front. This image was provided to PSP.

On 08/12/15, your affiant interviewed B.L.F. at the PSP York Station. B.L.F related that she was babysitting A.P.M.'s children on 12/09/14. She confirmed that A.P.M. previously explained her encounter with JOY visiting the house, and expressed concern that JOY might return. B.L.F. said A.P.M. told her not to answer the door if JOY came to the house, and advised her not to allow JOY inside for any reason. B.L.F. said that at approximately 1610 hours, her attention was drawn to the rear door of the residence after she heard the door handle being jostled. She said she observed a man at the rear door and then A.P.M.'s daughter shouted, "That's the judgel" B.L.F. said JOY said that while JOY was standing outside, he stated several times that he wanted to speak to A.P.M.'s son about basketball. B.L.F. advised that she told JOY she knew who he was and ordered him off the premises. B.L.F. said JOY then walked quickly back to his SUV which was parked in front of the house. B.L.F. said that JOY remained parked out in front of the house for several minutes, which scared her. She confirmed taking a cell phone picture of JOY'S vehicle which was fiated 12/09/14.

On 03/05/15 at 1057 hours, I Interviewed JOY relative to an investigation into the sexual assault of an adult female, M.C. JOY said he first met M.C. through District Court proceedings and acknowledged that he traveled to M.C.'s apartment on 02/19/15 and 03/04/15, confirming M.C.'s statement with a relative degree of consistency regarding their personal and phone interactions. However, when JOY was questioned about the alleged sexual encounter with M.C., he was evasive and deceptive. In the course of this interview it was determined that JOY made many false or inconsistent statements. In particular, JOY indicated he had never gone to the home of a victim or defendant, as he had done with M.C., at any point prior to our interview. The evidence collected in the course of this investigation into JOY's contact with A.P.M. Indicates that JOY lied during his police interview on 03/05/15.

Criminal charges contained within the attached criminal complaint were approved by the Office of Attorney General which has assumed jurisdiction of this prosecution under the Commonwealth Attorneys Act. Your affiant believes the above information establishes probable cause for the charges listed in the preceding criminal complaint, and believes the information contained within this document to be true and correct. I respectfully request that an arrest warrant be issued for the defendant, Jeffrey Scott JOY.



(Whereupon, the Defendant was sworn.)

ATTORNEY FERRO: Your Honor, I do have a plea colloquy which has been modified to reflect a no contest plea.

THE COURT: Very well. Have you shown that to the Commonwealth?

ATTORNEY FERRO: No, Your Honor.

THE COURT: Would you do that, please.

ATTORNEY FRANZ: And, Your Honor, I would note for the record one of the victims is present today and does wish to address the Court at the appropriate time. I would also note the -- I don't know if you want me to go into the specifics.

THE COURT: Well, we do need a factual basis, at least what I will call Reader's Digest version, that can support a plea in this matter. I mean it can be -- I mean you don't have to read the whole file, but it has to have at least a framework such that there is no question of the basis of the charge, and that the Defendant is entering that plea knowing exactly what is charged against him.

ATTORNEY FRANZ: Correct, Your Honor. I can do that at this point if you would wish.

THE COURT: You might as well.

ATTORNEY FRANZ: Okay. On Docket 6006 of 2015, the offense occurred at 28 Berkshire Drive in Shrewsbury Borough, York County, Pennsylvania, and on or about December 1st, 2014, at that date the Defendant did take advantage of his official capacity as a Magisterial District Judge of York County, Pennsylvania, by infringing on the rights of the victim in this case identified as an adult female, A.P.M. are her initials, by demanding that she model items of lingerie clothing at her residence in exchange for vacating her outstanding fines and costs.

THE COURT: Very well.

ATTORNEY FRANZ: Then on 6007 of 2015, at 28 Water Street, Apartment 34 in Glen Rock Borough, York County, Pennsylvania, on or about March 4th, 2015, the Defendant was present at that location and did again take advantage of his official capacity as a Magisterial District Judge of York County, Pennsylvania, by subjecting the victim in this case she is identified with the initials M.C. to mistreatment from the — in the form of unwanted sexual contact.

THE COURT: Very well.

ATTORNEY FRANZ: And again the victim whose initials are M.C. is present in court and does wish to address the Court at the appropriate time. The only other thing I would note is while this is an open plea and the Commonwealth will leave the length and other pieces of the sentence to the discretion of the Court, two conditions must be included in that sentence, and that includes that the Defendant will immediately resign from his judicial office, and that he will agree to never seek judicial or law enforcement office again in the future.

THE COURT: Mr. Ferro, does that -first of all, does your client understand, and you can
confer with him now to ask this question, that that's
the basis for the open plea of no contest to Count No.
3 and Count No. 1 respectively at 6006 and 6007 on the
docket?

ATTORNEY FERRO: Your Honor, we have spoken about this matter significantly and extensively prior to today's date. As the Court I believe knows, there is a significant dispute regarding the accuracy of those facts, however, there is a full acknowledgment

and understanding that if those particular facts were presented to a jury and subsequently believed by a jury, that they would form the basis for a conviction of Count 3 and Count 1 respectively.

THE COURT: Okay. Mr. Joy, will you please stand. Mr. Joy, although you are a Magisterial District Judge, I'm constrained to have to just make sure that this record is complete. Do you understand this plea agreement that has been outlined to the Court this afternoon?

THE DEFENDANT: Yes, sir, I do, yes, Your Honor.

THE COURT: Have you had a full and complete opportunity to discuss this matter with your counsel, Mr. Ferro?

THE DEFENDANT: Yes, Your Honor.

THE COURT: Are you satisfied with any and all responses to any inquiries that you have made to him or any discussions that you have had with him have provided you with whatever additional information you sought in the course of those discussions?

THE DEFENDANT: Yes, Your Honor.

THE COURT: Are you satisfied with his representation of you throughout this matter?

THE DEFENDANT: Yes, Your Honor.

THE COURT: Do you have any criticism at all of him, his professional representation of you?

THE DEFENDANT: No, Your Honor.

THE COURT: Okay. Do you further understand that although you are not admitting to these facts, that a plea of no contest is treated for the purposes of sentencing and the outcome of these cases as a plea of guilty, do you understand that?

THE DEFENDANT: Yes, Your Honor.

THE COURT: Okay. Do you understand the nature of the allegation against you at Docket 6006, which is Count No. 3, as described by the

Commonwealth's attorney, that being a count of misdemeanor graded official oppression, do you understand that charge against you?

THE DEFENDANT: Yes, Your Honor.

THE COURT: And to that charge how do

you plead?

THE DEFENDANT: No contest.

THE COURT: And, similarly, as to Count No. 1 at Docket 6007, do you understand the basis of that plea or that allegation against you?

THE DEFENDANT: Yes, Your Honor.

THE COURT: And to that charge how do

you plead?

THE DEFENDANT: No contest.

THE COURT: Very well. You may be seated. Thank you. Commonwealth, you have indicated that in the Case of 6007, the victim of that matter identified here for as M.M. wishes to be heard, is that correct?

ATTORNEY FRANZ: Yes, her initials are

M.C.

THE COURT: M.C., I'm sorry. Okay. Whoever that is, will they come forward. Will you stand -- remain standing and be sworn, please, by the clerk.

(Whereupon, the victim, M.C., was

sworn.)

THE COURT: Okay. Is both the Commonwealth and the Defense satisfied that both they, and especially on the side of the Defendant, understand who the true identity of the young lady is such that I do not have to have her to recite her name on the record in this case?

ATTORNEY FERRO: Yes, Your Honor, we are satisfied.

ATTORNEY FRANZ: Yes, Your Honor.

THE COURT: Very well. Good afternoon.

THE VICTIM: Hi.

Commonwealth, it wasn't always this way, but within the last couple decades the law has matured, let's use that word, okay, which establishes that in every instance in which there is a victim of crime, the victim has a right to be heard. Now, of course, we are not going to sit here this afternoon and listen to you read the Brooklyn telephone book, okay, but you have a right to be heard about any the matters that are involved in this case and ask the Court to consider your thoughts and feelings about the matter and to consider whatever suggestion or request that you may make as a result of this circumstance. So what would you like to tell me?

THE VICTIM: I just wanted to --

THE COURT: If you will pull that mic directly in front of you, that will help. Right there. That's good.

THE VICTIM: I just wanted to explain how his actions, his crimes have affected and impacted my life, and probably the other victims that were involved. He knew that I was in a vulnerable situation. He knew that I was not from Pennsylvania, and that I was alone. My boyfriend who I lived with was in jail, and he was the Judge for his case, and that was the day that, you know, I was in his courtroom.

He came, you know, to my apartment and abused his power as an MDJ of the Commonwealth and pretty much deceived me into thinking that he was there to help a victim -- a young minor who was my neighbor, and instead, you know, he took that time to pretty much -- he just -- he abused -- he abused my trust, and he was suppose to be a person that was an honorable Judge and somebody that had the citizens' best interest in mind, and I think he did everything that the law is against.

Basically, after he attacked me, I had to live in fear because I was afraid of what he or other people that knew him would do because I came

forward. He turned my whole life upside down. When my boyfriend finally got home from jail, we had to immediately just leave Pennsylvania just to get away, and we went back to Maryland, and still to this day all of my stuff is in a storage unit because I had no time to prepare. I just wanted to get away from here.

I had to go seek therapist just because I was in such a depression with everything. It was a domino effect, and I had been on numerous antidepressants because of this, which only made things worse. I lost my job that I had in Pennsylvania because my boss she knew -- I had to tell her what happened, and she -- I guess because of the nature of the crime she didn't want me working for her.

So it was really hard to get through everything that was happening all at once, and I don't think people that commit these crimes really stop to think about how their actions affect the victims. They think about what is happening to them, and they don't really stop to think about what they have done to other people and how it just doesn't stop at what they did. It just creates a nightmare, and, thankfully, it's been I guess about a year and a half since this happened, and I'm still dealing with a lot of the things from that.

I'm, thankfully, in Maryland, and I'm getting my life back together, and I'm happy cause I'm resilient, but it's been really difficult, and I just want him to know that. I can't speak for the other woman, but I'm sure they have similar experiences.

THE COURT: Very well.

THE VICTIM: Thank you.

THE COURT: Does the Commonwealth wish to proffer any questions to the lady?

ATTORNEY FRANZ: No, Your Honor.

THE COURT: Defense?

ATTORNEY FERRO: No, Your Honor.

THE COURT: Okay. Well, for what it's worth, today is the first day of the rest of your life with regards to this matter, and the strength that you

exhibited to come forward and be heard will not only assist you but will assist others who might some day find themself in a similar situation, okay. So draw some strength from the fact that you had the strength to come forward and be heard. Thank you for coming in.

THE VICTIM: Thank you.

THE COURT: And talking to me. Thank you. Commonwealth, do you wish to bring forward anything else?

ATTORNEY FRANZ: No, Your Honor.

THE COURT: Mr. Ferro, on behalf of the defense do you wish to bring forward anything else?

ATTORNEY FERRO: No specific testimony or witnesses, Your Honor, just a brief statement to the Court.

THE COURT: Okay. Well, the first thing I have to do here before we go any further with this is, Mr. Joy, under the constitution you have the right of allocution, which means that you have the right to be heard by the Court before the Court imposes any sentence on you for these matters. You don't have to say anything, but you do have the right to be heard. Do you wish to be heard?

THE DEFENDANT: No, Your Honor.

THE COURT: Thank you. Mr. Ferro.

ATTORNEY FERRO: Your Honor, I indicated to the Court I would be brief, and I will keep that promise. I would tell the Court that for just about half my life now I have been in and out of criminal courtrooms, all types Magisterial District Judges, Court of Common Pleas, Appellate Courts, et cetera, and over the course of that career, Your Honor, as it relates to Magisterial District Judges, I have never been before a kinder, friendlier, a nicer, a more learned, a more invested, a more interested, a more caring District Judge than Jeff Joy, and I thought that many, many, many months ago, and I still feel that way today.

No contest pleas are difficult, Your Honor, because it leaves certainly an aspect in which

there is still a significant dispute regarding the accuracy of certain facts, and the decision to move forward today in this regard is made for a number of different reasons, and most of those are not particularly relevant for this argument, but I'd ask the Court to consider the lifetime of service that Mr. Joy has given to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in so many different respects and the reputation that he enjoyed I believe throughout the Bar and individuals who appeared before him prior to this incident in fashioning a sentence that allows this matter to be over for all parties and, as the Court indicates, for tomorrow to be a new but different day for all parties. I'd ask the Court to consider that in fashioning an appropriate sentence.

THE COURT: Thank you. Commonwealth.

ATTORNEY FRANZ: Your Honor, the only comments I would make are just to again reiterate we are leaving sentence as a matter for the Court aside from the two conditions that I had mentioned, one being that he immediately resign from his judicial office and, two, that he agree to never seek judicial or law enforcement office again in the future.

SENTENCE

THE COURT: Okay. Well, the Commonwealth and the Defendant through his counsel have — the Court is aware of this because we have been assigned to this matter for awhile now, it being a matter most appropriately that would not be handled by one of the existing Judges in this county. Rather it's a classical type of situation where an out-of county Senior Judge is an appropriate judicial official to hear these kinds of cases, and, thus, I'm here. Okay.

There's no winners here today. There is only the potential of some healing and some other considerations. There's a lot of things I could do with this case, okay, however, I have given it some thought, and I think under the circumstances we are going to impose a sentence which we believe given the no contest plea is fair and just under the circumstances, and so we are going to proceed as follows:

Mr. Joy, please stand. On Docket No.

6006-CR-2015, at Count No. 3, the Court sentences you to pay the costs of prosecution, a fine of \$1,000, to undergo a period of probation which is two years in duration, this is a second degree misdemeanor, subject to some following conditions:

You will perform a hundred hours of community service on this count at this docket. You shall within 24 hours tender to the Governor of the Commonwealth, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, and to the Secretary of State an unequivocal, non-revocable resignation from your judicial office, which shall include a caveat that acknowledges that you will not seek or accept a judicial or law enforcement office in this Commonwealth for the duration of your natural life.

At Docket No. 6007, Count No. 1, the sentence is identical to the sentence at 6006. The probationary periods for this sentencing purpose only shall be concurrent. Additionally, and as I forgot to mention, the community service is a separate hundred hours in this one, and the community service going forward shall be performed at a rate of not less than five hours per week.

The director of Adult Probation services in York County shall at the director's discretion have the ability, if it's deemed appropriate, to have this be non-reporting but verifiable probation. If after the period of one year you have paid all your fines and costs, completed all of your conditions of community service, and have been otherwise on exemplary behavior, you may apply through counsel for a consideration of release from probation at both dockets.

I think under the circumstances, considering all of the factors here, you have not had any other kind of criminal history in this Commonwealth, that this meets both the objective of deterrence not only for you but especially for others and at the same time an opportunity to recompense your fellow citizens in York County for this entire matter. I believe that covers the conditions and the remainder of it. Commonwealth, do you have any observation as regards to any of this?

ATTORNEY FRANZ: Your Honor, I would just ask that the letter that is tendered within 24 hours that a carbon copy of that be delivered to the

Office of Attorney General.

THE COURT: So ordered. Mr. Ferro.

ATTORNEY FERRO: Your Honor, I believe there is a dismissal of remaining counts, but nothing other than that.

THE COURT: All right. Commonwealth, based upon that, there is a motion for dismissal of the other remaining counts at both dockets. Do you object?

ATTORNEY FRANZ: No, Your Honor.

THE COURT: So ordered. Mr. Ferro, will you advise your client of all of his post-sentencing rights such that that does not have to be articulated on the record at this time?

ATTORNEY FERRO: I will, Your Honor.

THE COURT: Anything further from the Commonwealth?

ATTORNEY FRANZ: No, Your Honor.

THE COURT: From the Defense.

ATTORNEY FERRO: No, Your Honor.

THE COURT: The court is adjourned. Thank you very much.
