ORDER

AND NOW, this 30th day of November, 2016, after consultation with the Capitol Police and the Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts (AOPC), it is **ORDERED**:

The hearing in the above-captioned matter will commence on Monday, December 5, 2016, at 10:00 a.m. The location has been moved to Courtroom 3002 on the third floor of the Pennsylvania Judicial Center, Harrisburg, Pennsylvania.

Decorum will be maintained at all times by all persons present in the courtroom.

Seating for the hearing shall be limited to 109 persons in the gallery on a "first come, first seated" basis. Twenty-five seats will be reserved for properly credentialed members of the media until 9:55 a.m. After 9:55 a.m., any remaining reserved seats for properly credentialed members of the media will be released to the public. Additional seating will be available for another 109 persons

in the gallery of Courtroom 3001, third floor, where the proceedings will be viewable through live audio and video feed.

No electronic devices may be used in Courtroom 3002 except by the Court and by the attorneys representing parties in this suit. Except for those electronic devices used by the Court and the attorneys, no electronic devices will be allowed in the courtrooms. Cell or smart phones may be carried into the courtrooms, but they must be turned off at all times.

Conference Room D on the first floor of the Pennsylvania Judicial Center shall be available for the use and storage of laptop computers and other electronic devices by members of the media. There will be judiciary personnel supervising Conference Room D, but security of items left in the room cannot be guaranteed.

Cameras will not be allowed beyond the first floor of the Pennsylvania Judicial Center. A podium will be available outside the Pennsylvania Judicial Center on the plaza for persons who wish to address the media.

The courtroom will be unlocked and available for seating approximately 30 minutes before the opening of court. The Capitol Police will begin processing members of the media approximately one hour before the opening of court.

Persons who fail to comply with this order or maintain proper courtroom decorum will be removed by Court personnel.
