## **PER CURIAM**

**AND NOW**, this 21st day of May, 2025, the Petition for Allowance of Appeal is **GRANTED**. The issue, as stated by Petitioner, is:

Whether the Commonwealth's waiver of sovereign immunity under the real estate exception allows recovery against PennDOT where the defective, rotted, and diseased portion of a tree that failed, fatally injuring a motorist travelling below, was located directly above PennDOT's roadway and within PennDOT's right-of-way, or does the fact that the base of the tree connected to the ground on the adjoining property of a third-party preclude PennDOT's liability, as the majority on a sharply divided three-judge Commonwealth Court panel concluded?
