Role of a Judge

Judge presides over the trial from a desk, called a bench.



Judges:

- Ensure the rules of court are followed by everyone
- Presides over court proceedings and ensures that order is maintained
- Determines whether any of the evidence presented is illegal or improper.
- Provides instructions to the jury before they begin their deliberations at the conclusion of a trial, ensuring that the jury determines the facts
- In the event of a bench trial, where there is no jury,
 the judge must determine the facts and decide the case.
- Sentence convicted criminal defendants
